Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, Nov. 14—Metropolitan daily papers are featuring President Roosevelt's comment about foreign investments in this country and also that legislation will be necessary to control the situation. Another piece of news which the papers are featuring is the S.E.C.'s charge against one stock exchange firm for supposedly manipulating Atlas Truck stock. Neither of these pieces of news lends much confidence to the market, especially in view of the sharp

advance it has had recently. Technically, the action of the rails yesterday was not good and if the market is not to have a sharp correction industrials will have to show greater resistance. However, the industrials average could react almost \$10 more without unfavorable indications. We would expect an irregular nervous market today and if any stocks do better we believe it will be the liquors, merchandise, truck and amusement.

GRAIN

CHICAGO, Nov. 15—In a market that climbed from first to last, Chicago wheat dealings ended strong on Saturday showing December contracts at the highest weekly close this season.

With the end of navigation on the Lakes and St. Lawrence only two weeks off, traders look increasing notices of reports indicating that the narrowest adjustment in 15 years prevails between world wheat supplies and probable demand.

Wheat closed firm, up 5-8 to 1-8 cents, Dec. 116 5-8 to 3-4, May 114 1-8 to 1-4, July 100 7-8 to 101, corn 1-4 off to 1-4 up, Dec 102 3-8 to 1-2, May new 95 7-8 to 96, July new 92 3-4 to 7-8, Oats 1-4 to 3-4 advanced, Dec 45 5-8, and rye showing 1 cent to 1-2 cents bulge, Dec. 90. Provisions varied from 2 cents decline to 20 cents gain.

PRODUCE

MONTREAL, Nov. 15—Butter and potato prices advanced in good buying on Montreal open produce markets this week. Eggs and cheese ruled quietly unchanged in generally light trading.

Butter closed at 25 1-4 to 1-2 cents per pound for carlots or less of no 1 while lots to retailers were 26 for solids and 26 1-2 for prints. Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were 45 to 46 cents a dozen for a large, 41 for a medium, 34 for 3 for a pullet, 26 for B and 22 to 22 1-2 for C.

Cheese averaged 14 cents per pound for Ontario and 13 1-2 for Quebecs. Potatoes: Que mts 80's \$1.12 to \$1.15; N. B. mts 80's -1.15 to \$1.20; Que no 2 80's \$1.05; P. E. I. mts 90's \$1.25 to \$1.40.

TORONTO, Nov. 15—Lake Shore stock sold at 62 on Toronto mining share market Saturday, the highest price in its history and up \$2 for the day. The advance came on a day of irregular price movements over the board.

Dome and McIntyre were down fractions and Pioneer dropped to a new low for the year at 6.25. Parolite lost 40 cents, Pickle Crow 5, Little Long Lac 5 and Buffalo-Ankerite was unchanged.

A few secondary golds changed hands in volume. Hard Rock and Macassa advanced 10 cents each, and gains of 3 to 5 cents were recorded for McLeod-Cookshut, Kirkland-Hudson Bay, Mining Corporation, East Malartic, Pamour, Perron and Reno.

NEW YORK, Nov. 15—Most European currency units advanced against the United States dollar, Saturday as a result, dealers said, of reaction to President Roosevelt's suggestion a curb be placed on the march of foreign capital into United States securities.

Both sterling and the French franc were higher, the former closing up 13-16 of a cent at \$4.89 1-8 and the latter up .00 3-4 of a cent at 4.85. Also in the procession were The Netherlands guilder which ended 11 of a cent higher, the Swiss franc up .03 of a cent, and the Belgian franc up 1-2 of a cent ahead. Canadian funds advanced 1-32 to 100 5-32.
