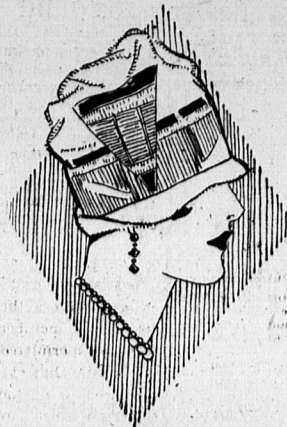
How To Make A Sachet Powder

COOL PREPARATIONS FOR SUICIDE BY DESPONDENT WOMAN AT FALLS.

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., Sept. 20. In full view of many tourists, Miss Jessie C. Biggar, thirty, of 22 Linwood Terrace, Buffalo, ended her life this morning by way of the American Falls. Although seen by many, it was impossible to do anything to avert the tragedy.

Miss Biggar made her preparations without hurry, and apparently calmly. She stood for some considerable time on the Goat Island Bridge gazing down over the falls. She then doffed her coat and pinned her name and address on the outside and laid it down with her glasses on top on the side of the bridge. She then climbed to the parapet, hung for a moment, and dropped into the rapids. She disappeared for half a minute, but was seen again. She turned on her back and used a back stroke to help her passage through the surging waters, and over the brink. She had picked a passage where there is clear water, free of rocks to impede her. Friends and relatives who came here today, say she was comfortably off, but had been ill and despondent for some time. The body has not been recovered.
