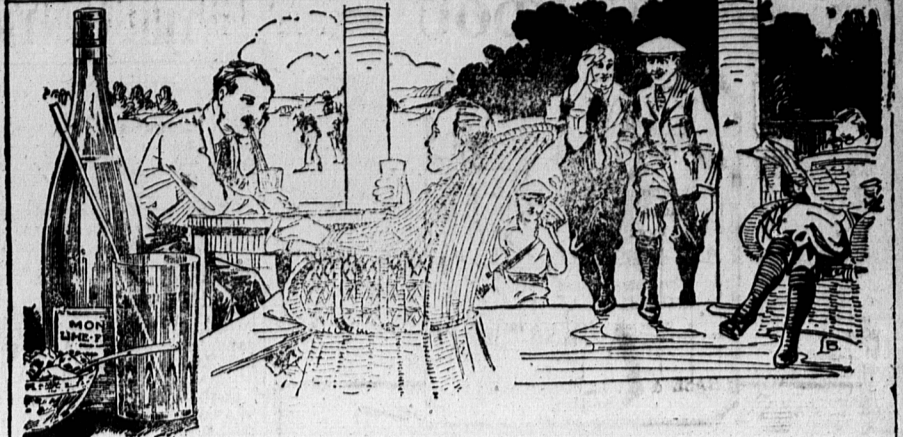

**EXPRESS COMPANIES TO BE CONSOLIDATED**

MONTREAL, July 10.—Officers of the Canadian Express Company and the Canadian National Express Company are working in close harmony under the direction of the board of management of the Grand Trunk Railway System and already arrangements have been made whereby at common points where both express companies have maintained separate offices, staffs and wagon service, these will be consolidated and managed under a joint agent in the interest of both companies. Consolidations have thus been made at Hawkesbury, Brookville, Nananoe, Kingston, Belleville, Trenton, Port Hope, Cobourg, Oshawa, North Bay and Pembroke, Ont.; Regina, Moose Jaw, and Saskatoon, Sask.; Calgary and Edmonton, Alta.; Similar steps will be taken at the larger cities as soon as details can be worked out.
