THE present is ideal weather for bicycling, and votaries of the past are enjoying it; perhaps none to a greater degree than Mr. W. P. Doull who may often be seen enjoying the morning air mounted upon his novel wheel. Mr. Doull has fitted in front of the saddle a safe and cosy seat in which he takes his little girl out riding, while on another seat fitted in the rear of the saddle his son and heir enjoys the sport with all the inebriated keenness of Mr. Doull himself.

A VERY pleasant afternoon and evening were spent by the members of the Mimingash Methodist Sunday School and their friends on Thursday, Sept. 29th, at 2 p. m. Later many members of the congregation and their friends filled the tables. At 7 p. m. the pastor, Rev. John Goldsmith of Alberton, entertained the congregation in the church by giving an account of his recent trip to England and the Isle of Man. The congregation listened with evident interest and were delighted with the many fine views of places visited and objects seen which were thrown upon the screen. Twenty dollars was realized towards the church fund.

REV. D. CRAWFORD, of New Glasgow, preached an able discourse last evening from I Cor., 13 chap., "Now abideth Faith, Hope and Charity, these three, but the greatest of these is Charity." The meeting was one of a series of evangelistic services now being held with the Central Christian Church of this city in the Kindergarten Hall. These services will be continued throughout this week every afternoon at 3 o'clock and evening at 7.30. At the close of the social meeting at 3 o'clock this afternoon Miss Rioch, a returned missionary from Japan, will speak to an audience of women only on missionary work in Japan. A large attendance of women from all denominations is urgently requested. At 7.30-tonight Rev. R. W. Stevenson of Montague, who is well and favorably known in this city will preach, and it is hoped that many will avail themselves of the opportunity of having the message that shall be presented by the rev. gentleman.

THE regular monthly meeting of the School Board was held yesterday evening. The enrollment for the month was 1349, viz: 777 boys and 572 girls. The average attendance was 1.186 and the percentage of tardiness 88. The number of cases of tardiness in Prince Street school was 81, Queen Square 88, West Kent 41. The fewest cases of tardiness were in Prince Street, Miss Harris' and Miss McKinnon's rooms none, Queen Square, Mr. Smith's none, West Kent, Miss Ashley's none. No truants were reported from Prince Street, four from Queen Square and 15 from West Kent. The teachers of Prince Street made 84 visits to parents, Queen Square 18, and West Kent 126. There were no cases of corporal punishment in Prince Street, 12 in Queen Square and 13 in West Kent. In Prince Street 38 pupils fall below average required for grading, Queen Square 50, West Kent 122. There were 137 requests to leave school before the hour for closing. The teachers, request to be allowed time to attend the Teachers Convention was granted. A committee was appointed to ascertain the cost of a proper system of sewerage for Queen Square school.

EASTERN ITEMS.—The farmers are thrashing their crops, and a few have commenced digging their potatoes. Their worst fears about both are realized. In my last I stated that the crops would not average a half, but a quarter would be nearer the mark, and the quality the very poorest. The early potatoes are rotting, the late ones small and soft. —Though the price of cheese has been low for the season, yet the patrons of the East Point Factory are satisfied with their returns, and realize the fact that the old system of farming, the raising of oats and potatoes alone, has become unprofitable, and that the adoption of the dairy system in whole or in part is now a matter of necessity. —There is no fishing about East Point at present, the whole gulf, north and south being swarming with those wolves of the sea—dogfish, voracious in their habits, repulsive to other fish, and destructive to lines and fishing gear. They come into the gulf suddenly in immense bodies, and leave just as suddenly. Something brings them in, what is it? There is some reason for the immigration of all fish, generally they go in quest of food, or in pursuit of some other smaller fish, sometimes they are likely fleeing from their enemy. The last few years immense schools of squid visited our shores, and the fishermen used them extensively for bait, especially for hake, this year but very few put in an appearance, hence not many hake were caught—Leo McDonald of Munn's Road, with commendable enterprise, is putting a crusher into his steam mill for the benefit of his numerous patrons, as well as to his own profit. In these days of small profits, when feeding stock has become a necessity to every successful farmer such machines are a public convenience, and should be patronized extensively by every stock raiser in the neighborhood.
