Young Star Equals Two Ball Marks

PITTSBURGH, Sept. 22.—Lloyd Waner, sensational young pirate outfielder, equalled the modern major league record for singles in one season, and set another number of safeties by a first year man in the past week, unofficial records show.

He gathered his 179th single from the Brooklyn Dodgers yesterday, tying the modern record set by Johnny Tobin of the St. Louis Browns in 1921. The all-time record, however, is 199, set by Willie Keeler in 1897.

Waner, serving his first year in the major leagues several days ago, reached the 200 mark in total hits, a feat never achieved by a first year man, so far as available records show.

Pirates Win; Forge Ahead With Margin

NEW YORK, Sept. 22.—The Pirates resumed their pennant march in the National League today with a victory over Brooklyn which advanced their margin on the crest to 3 1/2 games. An open date kept the Giants and Cards idle and the clubs continued to share a second-place tie.

Ella Watts Trots Oval In 2.09 3-4

FREDERICTON, Sept. 22.—Three favorites fell by the wayside, the trotting records for the track was broken, then equalled and broken again, and a new record for Maritime Province-bred trotters was set up, in a hectic afternoon's racing, which opened the Fredericton Exhibition's racing program today.

Thirteen heats were raced and 2:13 3/4 was the slowest time of the afternoon's speed carnival. Mary Volo, owned by George M. Reed, of Fort Fairfield, Maine, leading the pacing speedsters when she paced the first mile of the 2:18 early closer for \$1,000, while Gwendolyn Aubrey, the Nova Scotia-bred trotter, owned by Fred Simpson, of Limestone, Maine, set up a new trotting record for the track of 2:10 1/4, which Ella Watts, owned by M. D. Higgins, of Denbysville, Me., equalled the next heat, and then reduced to 2:09 3/4 the next heat.

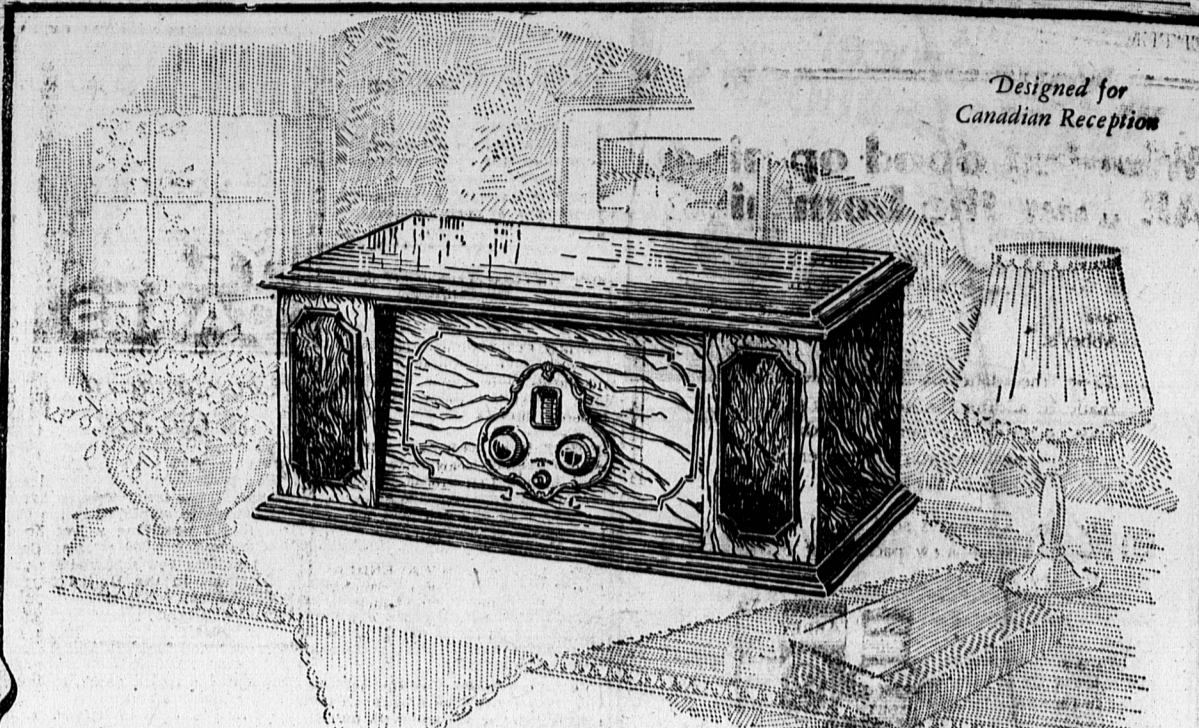
It was the first heat trotted in 2:10 or better on the Maine and New Brunswick Circuit, and Gwendolyn Aubrey's mile in 2:10 1/4 set a new record for Maritime-bred trotters, this mark having formerly been held by Bill Sharon, 2:04 1/4, which trotted in here before he was sold to the Murphy Grand Circuit stable for \$28,000, the highest price ever paid for a Canadian-bred trotter.
