MORNING MARKET LETTER

NEW YORK, May 5—Although turnover was low yesterday, it showed an improvement over the preceding day and the tone of the market was somewhat better throughout the session. Dividend payments by two leading industrial—GM and J—were larger than expected and a firm closing in London served to diminish some of the fears with respect to liquidation from that point. With the increased member bank reserve requirements now in full effect and excess reserves standing in the neighborhood of \$850,000,000 an improved demand for bonds is a reasonable expectation. Greater receptiveness of the capital markets to new issues particularly is an important consideration in aiding continuance of the recovery movement. We would expect market confidence to increase but believe that there is likely to be some irregularity caused by profit taking over the near term. Therefore, we would follow a policy of buying principally on dips in the market or individual issues.

NOON COMMENT

Prices are slightly off on the day but the market is quiet and showing a good deal of firmness. Possibly lack of more aggressive news on the upside might lead to a dip this afternoon or tomorrow but we would be inclined to regard such a development as a buying opportunity. Better action coming into Atchison recently in our opinion suggests the possibility of a worthwhile advance in the stock if the winter wheat crop prospects continue favorable we think that Bor New is showing up relatively well.
