Fresh Air and Varied Work Make for Stamina and Resourcefulness

Other things being equal—and by "other things" I mean natural ability, baseball brains and nerve—I would pick the country boy in place of the city chap for my ball team, says the famous Cy Young. In making this statement, an dividing the country into two classes—cities and country—including in the latter division the villages and small towns which in reality are nothing more than the country, for in them boys have the advantage of country life, which is plenty of work and fresh air. Still, I believe the fact that I was born and raised on a farm is largely responsible for my success as a pitcher. I was naturally rugged, and my farm work as a boy tended to make me more so. They would go along splendidly for a few innings, but when the real test came they were lost sight of, and now are all but forgotten, whereas had they had the same early training I received, they might have remained in the game as long as I have. The argument that city boys think faster and are more independent is not a good one. In fact, I believe it is entirely wrong. The country boy must think as fast and as often as the boy in the city, and he is thrown upon his own resources much oftener. All in all, give me the boy from the country—the boy who has survived the hard knocks—for a diamond star.

CARE OF MILK AND CREAM

It is impossible to produce clean milk and cream unless the cows, stable, milker, utensils, and separator are clean.

To wash milk utensils use, first, cold water for rinsing; second, warm water containing a small quantity of good washing powder for cleaning; third, boiling water or steam for sterilizing. Use a metallic strainer; it is practically impossible to keep cloth strainers sweet and clean and free from bacteria. Skim the milk as soon after milking as possible, and cool the cream at once. Skim a cream testing from 35 to 45 per cent—the richer the cream the better it will keep. By skimming a rich cream, more skim milk is left at home for feed, and there is also a smaller bulk on which to pay express charges. Do not mix warm, new cream with cold cream until it has been cooled. Keep the cans of cream in a tank of cold water until time of delivery. Wash the separator thoroughly after each separation. Deliver the cream to the creamery or cream station early in the morning. Deliver the cream not less than three times a week during the summer, and twice a week during the winter. Protect the cans of cream from the sun by covering with canvas or with a wet sack while en route.

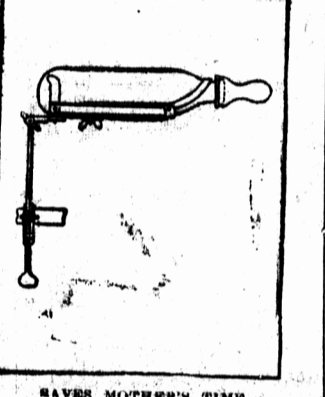

HOLDS BABY'S BOTTLE

Adjustable Arm Clamps on Side of Crib or Couch. It is not every mother who has time to sit and hold her infant's nursing bottle or, even if she has the time, it may be that she finds it a bit fatiguing. A mechanical hold will answer the purpose quite as well. Two curved metal plates, slidably mounted together, receive the bottle. A yoke on the outer end passes over



SAVES MOTHER'S TIME. The neck of the bottle and curved spring arms at the other end engage the lower end of the milk container. This holder is mounted on an adjustable standard which can be clamped to the side of the baby's crib or couch or wherever he happens to be. The horizontal arm can then be tilted to any angle so that it is directly in front of the infant's mouth, and he can pull away to his heart's content while mother attends to other duties.

CENTURY OLD CANOE

Relic of Indians Washed Ashore at Niagara. During a gale which swept Lake Ontario there was washed up on the beach at Niagara-on-the-Lake an old dugout canoe, which caused the townspeople a good deal of speculation, as judging by its timbers it is certainly very aged. The strange craft came ashore in two sections, which, put together, made a canoe of twenty feet. It is a dugout, made of a huge tree trunk, as it is nearly six feet wide. It is entirely covered with bark. The supposition is that it was an old Indian war canoe which sank in the Niagara River maybe a century ago. Becoming embedded in mud at the bottom of the river, it lay there for many years until loosened by ice in a shift in the current. The Niagara Historical Society have possession of the canoe.

STEALING FINE ORE

High-graders Adopt Ingenious Schemes to Get the Metal. Some very interesting methods are resorted to by both men and women "high-graders" to bring stolen silver in a crude state out of the Northern Ontario mining district, according to a report of the Provincial police. Several used specially constructed duck bags which fitted in a natural manner about the body, and when loaded merely added to the corpulence of the individual. One woman, trusting to the female attire for protection, concealed 80 pounds in her skirts, but was intercepted before making good her escape. Another formed a metal belt of the silver ore suspended on strings, but shared the same fate.
