A correspondent from Wood Islands, and vicinity writes:—The Go Preachers at present holding meetings in Wood Islands West, are creating quite an excitement, but have had poor success in making converts.—Ernest McLeod Vernon River, and Ernest Shaw, Uigg, paid a visit to Wood Islands recently. They were the guests of John and Mrs McIsaac, Southern Gem Lodge, I. O. G. T., in a flourishing condition. They intend soon to erect a new hall for the use of the Lodge.

Smelt fishing in Cape Breton promises to be more extensively indulged in during the coming winter season than heretofore. Last year several experienced P. E. Island smelt fishermen came quietly to Cape Breton, and entered into the industry on a large scale. That there is money in the smelt fishery here is evident by the return of the Islanders, and already several are on the field making preparations for an active campaign. Among the first arrivals here last week was William Smith, of Alberton, who last year spent a couple of months in the vicinity of Leitches Creek, where he cleaned up a good money as a result of shipments of smelts to the American market. Another P. E. Islander named Bell is negotiating for the winter's campaign in this industry, which for years lay dormant. When it is remembered that many thousands of American dollars went into the pockets of industrious P. E. Islanders from the smelt fishery in their native province, their presence here augurs well for the future of smelt fishery in Cape Breton.—North Sydney Herald.
