EXPORT SHIPMENTS OF EGGS TO THE U.K.

In 1940 a total of 10,677,900 dozen eggs was exported from Canada to the United Kingdom. Exports from each province were, in the order of quantity, as follows: Ontario, 5,001,270 dozen; Manitoba, 1,563,900 dozen; Saskatchewan, 1,272,800 dozen; British Columbia, 1,063,270 dozen; Quebec, 839,040 dozen; Alberta, 819,720 dozen; Prince Edward Island, 120,000 dozen and Nova Scotia, 7,500 dozen.
