TWO VALUABLE RECIPES

One Egg Cake

1/4 cupful Borden's St. Charles Milk, diluted with 1/4 cupful cold water.
1/4 cupful vegetable cooking oil, scant.
2-3 cupful sugar
1 egg
1/2 teaspoonful salt
1 1/2 teaspoonfuls baking powder
1 1/2 cupfuls sifted flour
1/2 teaspoonful vanilla
1/2 teaspoonful lemon extract
Beat the egg, light and cream it with sugar, salt, and flavoring. Combine the milk, diluted, with the cooking oil. Sift together the dry ingredients and add them alternately to the first mixture with the milk. Beat thoroughly, turn into a lined, medium-sized pan and sprinkle nut meats, chopped raisins or cocoanut over the top. Bake in a moderate oven for thirty minutes.

Strawberry Short Cake

2 cupfuls flour
2 teaspoonfuls baking powder
1 teaspoonful salt
2 rounding tablespoonfuls butter
2 rounding tablespoonfuls granulated sugar
1 cupful Borden's St. Charles Milk, undiluted.
Sift all the dry ingredients together, work in butter, as you would for pie crust, add the milk, beat with spoon (it will be very stiff) and bake 20 minutes in an oblong pan. Split the cake with a hot knife, butter the two sides and put them together with two quarts of strawberries which have been cut into small pieces, sweetened and allowed to stand before placing on cake.

GREAT SPECIALIST A NATIVE OF NOVA SCOTIA

NEW YORK, May 29.—Dr. David Webster, internationally known oculist and eye surgeon, died Saturday after a long illness. He was 81 years old and had not been active recently in his profession. Throughout his entire career he held many important posts, including the surgical directorship of the largest eye, ear and nose hospitals in New York and at various times held important posts in medical associations. Dr. Webster was a native of Cambridge, N. S., where his body will be taken for burial. He succeeded from John Webster, a colonial Governor of Connecticut and on his mother's side from Sir Charles Tupper, a Prime Minister of Canada. He numbered among his relatives Daniel Webster, statesman, to whom the doctor bore a striking resemblance. Dr. Webster was a teacher in New York Polytechnic Institute, Dartmouth, Medical College and other schools, chief surgeon of Manhattan Eye, Ear and Nose Hospital. He was President of the New York County Medical Society, and a member of various historical societies. He made numerous contributions to medical literature.

EIGHT ANNUAL MEETING

While the details of the Programme for the Eighth Annual Meeting have not yet been completed, the plans of the Committee on Arrangements have so far advanced as to give assurance that the Meeting will be a memorable one in the history of the Association. It will be held in the City of Montreal on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, the 4th, 5th and 6th of September, 1923, with Convention Headquarters at the Hotel Royal. The Committee have great pleasure in announcing that the Hon. Charles Evans Hughes, Secretary of State of the United States, has consented to attend the Meeting and make the Annual Address. The high position occupied by Mr. Hughes as the leading member of the United States Administration would ensure his a cordial welcome from Canadian lawyers, but, aside from that, his distinguished career at the Bar and as a member of the Supreme Court of the United States marks him as one of the foremost members of the profession. So far as can be ascertained, this is the first time that an American Secretary of State has visited Canada during his term of office, except on official business. The presence of Mr. Hughes, therefore, is significant of the prestige of the Canadian Bar Association and of the opportunity which its meetings afford for the cultivation of friendship and goodwill between the United States and Canada. The Rt. Hon. The Earl of Birkenhead in the public life of Great Britain during the past fifteen years and especially his work as Lord Chancellor from 1918 to 1922 have brought him so prominently before the Bar of Canada that he is a measure associated with his name consolidating and revising the law relating to Real Property assure us that his political activities have not overshadowed his interest in the law. The Earl of Birkenhead is the third in the line of those who have filled the great office of Lord Chancellor to address the Canadian Bar Association, and it is certain that his visit and his addresses will arouse lively interest in the profession and the public generally. The governing bodies of the Bar in both France and Belgium have been invited to send delegates to the Meeting, and we expect members of the Bar from these countries. Leading members of the Bench and Bar of Canada will make addresses and take part in the discussions. There will be presented for consideration report on such subjects as the Administration of Justice, Legal Education, Uniform Legislation and other questions of moment to the Bar. A very important report on the Administration of Criminal Justice in which amendments to the "Criminal Code" are suggested, will be one of the leading matters for discussion. Every effort will be made to provide for the comfort and convenience of members attending the Meeting. It will be appreciated if those contemplating being present will notify the Secretary-Treasurer. A special programme of entertainment will be arranged for Ladies. Change, even from worse to better is not made without inconvenience.
