Penalty for Bribery is

forfeiture of \$325.00 for each offence to the person who shall sue for the same. Every person giving liquor to any Elector on Polling Day within an Electoral district where such polling shall be held, is liable to a penalty of \$16.00.

Penalties not exceeding \$65.00 may be sued for in a summary manner before two Justices of the Peace for the County. In default of payment or recovery of the penalty the offender is subject to imprisonment.

ELECTORS! Do not let the value of your vote be cancelled by anyone who sells his citizenship for a consideration of any kind. 11-11dr12i.

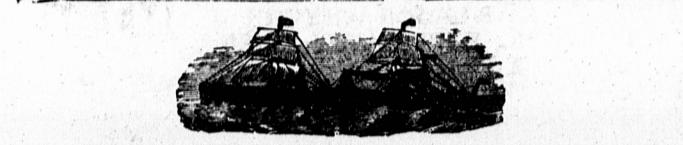

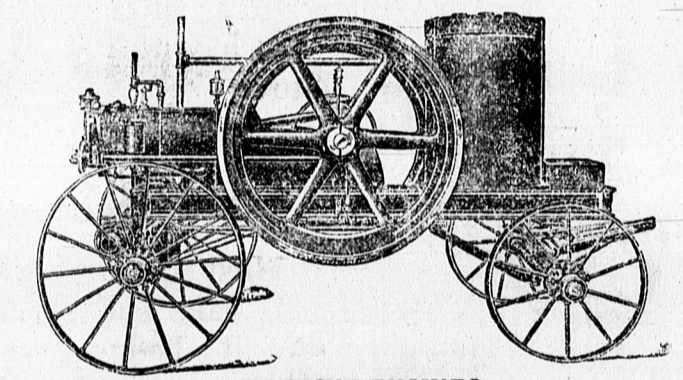
