THE Provincial W. C. T. U. Convention will meet in Summerside on June the 7th and 8th. An executive meeting will be held on Thursday the 7th at 1.40 p. m. The convention proper will open at 2.30 p. m. The other sessions will be held on Thursday evening, and Friday morning and afternoon. Those sessions will be open to the public. A splendid program is in course of preparation for the Y's public meeting on Friday evening in the Market Hall. Everybody should reserve that night for a special treat.

Mr. A. McKinnon of Coleman returned Friday evening from Quebec where he had been attending the lumber limit auction which he speaks of as being a very extensive, one lumber privileges selling at a much higher rate than has ever been known in the history of Quebec. As an instance Mr. Edwards of Ottawa brought 683 square miles which cost him about \$78,000 for which payment was made on the spot. This is only one of many similar sales. The limits were sold by the Government and from 12 o'clock noon till one o'clock, \$150,000 cash was realized and it was estimated that the day's sale would amount to at least \$300,000. Mr. McKinnon bought 30 miles in the vicinity of his mills at Gaspe at an upset price of \$30 per mile. In addition to this amount a yearly increase fee of \$3 per mile and a fire tax yearly of \$1.50 per mile is paid. He considers himself fortunate in having secured a magnificent strip of lumber which cost him only about \$1000. These purchases include the lumber only. The government still retaining the land.

ANOTHER outrage in Summerside.
During the early hours of yesterday morning two front windows of Messrs. Brace, McKay & Co's store were again broken with bricks. This outrage is the worse from the fact that the windows replaced others which were broken in the same dastardly manner a few weeks ago. Every effort ought to be made to run to earth the scoundrels who did the deed, as until they are brought to justice, the property of no reputable citizen is safe.

HOOD VS. HOOD.
C. I. Hood & Co. Victorious in Important Cases—Injunction Against Dr. J. C. Hood.

Important suits have just been decided in the U. S. Circuit Courts involving the right to the name Hood or Hood's. Messrs. C. I. Hood & Co., of Lowell, Mass., proprietors of Hood's Sarsaparilla, began suit for infringement against Dr. J. C. Hood of Louisville, Ky., who was putting up what he called "Dr. Hood's Sarsaparilla" after a hearing in the U. S. Circuit Court at Louisville, Judge Evans on April 12 granted a temporary injunction in favor of C. I. Hood & Co., and restraining J. C. Hood from using the word Hood in any way or form on any preparation of sarsaparilla.
Messrs. C. I. Hood & Co. also began suit against a retail druggist in Indianapolis, Louis Benker, who was selling Dr. J. C. Hood's Sarsaparilla. Dr. J. C. Hood employed counsel and made a defence, but Judge Baker of the U. S. Circuit Court granted an injunction which on April 23 became perpetual.
These two decrees establish the exclusive right of C. I. Hood & Co. to the word "Hood's" and decide in effect that no other person can put up a Hood's Sarsaparilla even if his name is Hood, nor can any retail druggist sell or offer for sale any sarsaparilla hearing the name Hood or Hood's other than that prepared by C. I. Hood & Co.
These decisions will be gratifying to every fair minded person. No manufacturer should object to fair competition, but when an attempt is made to steal or infringe upon a business which has been established by great skill, labor and expenditure, justice cannot be dealt out too quickly.
