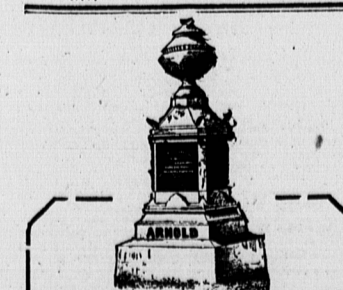

The Department of Agriculture of this Province advises the farmers that care should be taken not to use Paris Green with Lime Sulphur Wash as it is sure to burn the leaves, where the Lime Sulphur is used. Arsenate of Lead is the poison that must be used with it. The Lime Sulphur too must be used at summer strength, which is 1 gal. of the commercial wash to 35 of water. If it is used at winter strength the foliage will be burned.

Some time ago Michael Paul, Rocky Point, made rather a nice capture in a woods in West river in which he was walking. Having a previous knowledge of the existence of a number of fox dens Mr. Paul had made it his business to pay this particular section of the country a visit very frequently in the hope of locating one of the dens and his expectations have been realized. On the occasion referred to in the opening sentence Paul came across a den with seven cubs in it, the little fellows being about a couple of weeks old. One of the old folks was observed in the distance at the time of the capture but she could not be persuaded to wait while she, too, was made captive. The little ones were taken to Mr. Paul's home at Rocky Point and in a few days he disposed of them to David Irving, M.P., Ver-non River, for a tidy sum. Mr. Irving represented recently to the Guardian representative that the youthful reynards were doing exceedingly well in restraint and made a very good beginning for a more complete fox farm.
