RING BROUGHT MISFORTUNE.

Among the many curiosities left by the late Lady Meux is an Egyptian mummy which is said to have brought ill luck to everyone who handled it.

The story is fairly well known, for two years ago all the daily papers were full of it. It is sufficient to say that from the time of the discovery of the coffin in 1889, the priestesses seemed to bring misfortune to every one who had anything to do with her coffin.

Then there was the case of George Alefounder, who, having discovered a mummy too large to conveniently carry away, deliberately beheaded it and brought the head back to Europe in a bonnet box.

As it happened, Mr. Alefounder had at the time forgotten all about the mummy head. No one remembered it, and, much startled, consulted another medium. From her he heard precisely the same story.

The late Shah of Persia owned a dagger which is said to make its possessor invincible. But the superstition is that he who uses it shall inevitably perish by it, it is kept securely locked in a sandalwood box.

dagger is vouchered for by C.W. Leadbeater. A certain English family owns a stiletto which inspires everyone who holds it with a horrible and almost irresistible desire to kill some woman.

This weapon belonged to an ancestor or whose wife deceived him and drove him mad. He swore revenge against the whole sex, and with the dagger killed his wife, his wife's sister and another woman before he was disarmed and secured.

In the summer of 1906 M. Andreeff, a well known business man of St.

Petersburg, bought at auction for \$2,000 a beautiful old necklace made about 120 years ago by a famous Parisian jeweler for the ill-fated Louis VI.

Nearly all of the members of the French Royal family lost their lives in the revolution, but the necklace was taken by the survivor to Brussels and there sold. Over and over again it changed hands, and every one who owned it was unlucky.

Such instances may be multiplied. Count Zahrowski when killed in a fearful motor accident at Nice in 1903, was wearing the fatal ring which had belonged to his family for 14 generations, every head of which had met a violent death.

Still more amazing is a story told by the late head of the Paris Morgue. Five times within his experience dead bodies brought to the morgue were found to be wearing a certain ring

easily distinguished by its strange design. It bore in eastern characters this legend: "May whosoever wears this ring die a horrible death." M. Mace, the Chief of the Paris police, vouches for the truth of this story.
