Three very interesting billiard games were played last evening in connection with the Billiard League competition, when Bulcock, of the Church of England Institute defeated Noddin of the Oddfellows by 110 points, and both Priest and Heffernan, of the Oddfellows, scored victories over Gass. St. George's and Dauphinee, of the Institute team. Each of the three games was well attended, and a very excellent brand of billiards put up by the players.

BULCOCK VS NODDIN

This match was played at the Institute billiard room. Bulcock early took the lead, scoring freely and making several useful runs before he reached his first century. Noddin on the other hand, out of practice, failed to hold the balls together, and little by little the No. 2 player of the Institute swelled his lead to 100 points.

HEFFERNAN VS DAUPHINEE

The No. 3 players of the Oddfellows and C. of E. Institute put up a rattling good game, which was watched by a large crowd at Oddfellows Hall. It was a close contest all the way up to the 450 mark, when Heffernan placed the issue beyond doubt when he compiled a splendid break of 46. Previous to this, it was a case of nip and tuck throughout the game.

GASS VS PRIEST

This match was played at the Casino billiard parlors, when the fans were treated to some interesting billiards up to the 300 mark, but Bob Gass fell off then, and Priest had no difficulty in reaching the 500 mark, by the time his opponent had scored 383. The first century was reached when Gass was 50 points behind Priest. When Priest returned the 200 mark, he was 80 ahead of Gass, at 300 he had increased his lead to 127, while Gass was 126 behind.

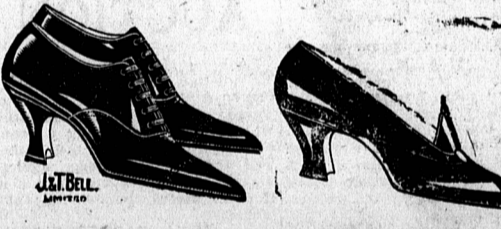
