This intention leads to profound disorganization of the supply of the peaceful civil population with necessities, gravely endangers the health and lives of the people, and portends innumerable calamities for the masses of people."

City Clerk's Office Near Completion

Meal Process Of Value For Local Use

Questioned yesterday concerning the merits of the recent development in Newfoundland of a simple home-made apparatus for manufacturing fish meal out of the offals of fish, Mr. W. R. Shaw, Deputy Minister of Agriculture, stated that "for a man's own use it would be of considerable advantage in the production of fish meal." In yesterday's Guardian he was reported as saying that the process would be of any benefit here. Mr. Shaw explained that when he made that statement he was referring to the commercial use of the apparatus. He did not use of the apparatus to be utilized by the fisherman. "In districts where farmers lived near the fishermen and offals were available, it should prove very successful," said Mr. Shaw, "and with this thought in mind we are following the question up further with the intention of establishing what is a home-made plant in this province to demonstrate their practical value."
