Gave Absolution To Drowning Boy.

Le Journal, this morning, relates peculiar circumstances attending the drowning accident at Back River yesterday, when John Prevost, 12 years old, lost his life. Two men, Le Journal says, Messrs. Laetance Giroux and Dr. Laverque, were coming along the bank when suddenly they spied a child floating down the stream. The current was very strong and they were unable to give any assistance. The boy could not swim, and the men shouted out to him not to lose courage. It was soon seen, however, that there was no possibility of the boy being saved, and the men ran quickly for the parish priest, Rev. Father Bellefleur. The cure hurried to the shore and at once recognized the boy, and told him to prepare himself for death in case he could not reach the shore. Young Prevost understood it was all over with him, and in a great effort raised his hands in prayer and made the sign of the cross. At the same moment the priest said a prayer and gave absolution to the boy raising his hand and also making the sign of the cross. Twenty minutes later the body of the boy was recovered. The coroner was notified and held an inquest, disposing of the case summarily.—Montreal.

Human Longevity Increasing.

Life insurance actuaries in England and Scotland have been engaged for eight years in studying mortality tables, and they find that the average length of human life is increasing. They have just completed an examination of the mortality records of 600,000 persons, and they affirm that the increase is both notable and steady. This is the natural and inevitable effect of several causes, the chief of which, perhaps, is the birth and development of sanitary science, by which the spread of diseases has been checked. It is beyond all doubt, too, that people pay more attention than formerly to the laws of personal hygiene. In every way they regulate their lives more rationally, owing to the wider extension of education and the more exact knowledge of the effects of neglect. Labor saving machinery has relieved men of the hardest toil, and children and women are prevented by law from working an excessive number of hours in factories. That intemperance has greatly diminished is obvious, and people are better fed, clothed and housed than at any other time in the history of the race. Old age as well as death, says The Philadelphia Record, commenting on the report, has been pushed further away. Youth lasts longer than formerly. As recently as a century ago it was common for girls of sixteen to become wives, while the young women of twenty-five who was still unmarried was regarded as well within the borders of confirmed spinsterhood. It is probable that now more young women are married at twenty-five than at twenty. Men are now in the zenith of their powers between forty and fifty, and a man of sixty is no longer old. The proportion who pass the limit of life fixed by the Psalmist in good health, and with no apparent decline of intellectual vigor, is greater than ever.
