We want immigrants from the United Kingdom we want more of the stock that has made our province the richest, acre for acre and man for man, in Canada. We want to perpetuate the love of learning which our forefathers brought with them to this province...

Unfortunately in this commercial age of ours we have paid more attention to our material prosperity than to our educational advantages and the latter are not what they were when education was more highly prized than it is today.
