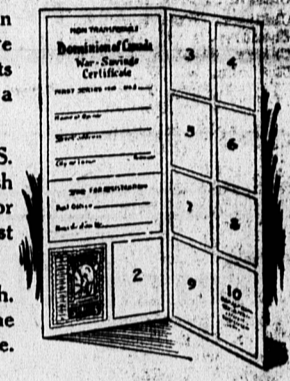

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations
THIS sole, head of a family or one male over eighteen years of age, homestead applicant of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entries by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.
Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within the limits of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alone, or a homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.
Duties Six months residence in each of three years after entering homestead, plus also 90 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead is pre-empted on certain conditions.
A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside at least 90 days in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200.
The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be obtained for purchase on certain conditions.
