THE P. E. I. HOSPITAL.

A prominent citizen who has taken a generous interest in the P. E. Island Hospital has directed our attention to the need of a ward for infectious diseases. The want has been especially felt during the current winter since diphtheria has broken out in the City and shows itself persistent. If there were some ward to which such patients could be removed when first attacked, the desired isolation could be thus secured for the patient, and the disease might be prevented from spreading in the house. The infected house could be fumigated and freed from disease germs. At the same time the patient would be assured of better attention and care in the Hospital than he could obtain in his home.

As all are quite aware patients having infectious disease cannot be sent to a general hospital, lest they infect other patients. An entirely separate ward, or better still a separate building would be required for the purpose. Now it so happens that there is a separate building on the Hospital grounds—the Brecken dwelling-house—which might be made available for the purpose. It would require some fitting up indeed, but for so important an object no doubt some special subscriptions could be obtained. We commend the consideration of this matter to the Hospital Board.

While on the subject of Hospital improvements we may say that one or two other suggestions have been offered us which might be worth thinking over. The institution is one which is so excellent in many ways and stands so high in the regard of the people of the City and Province that we feel assured any suggestions made in the way of practical improvement will be welcomed and considered in the same spirit as they are offered. One of these suggestions is that an ice-house be erected on the premises where ice can be stored during the winter for use in the summer season. In this way the large quantity of ice needed by the institution would be obtained at cost, instead of being purchased and delivered daily. There seems little doubt that it would be more economical for the Hospital to own and control its own ice supply.

Another suggestion on which there might be more difference of opinion is in regard to the supply of milk for the Hospital. A good deal of milk is used in the institution. There are some fifteen acres of good land connected with it, and the suggestion is made that it might be found both economical, and desirable on other grounds for the institution to have its own small herd of cows, thus assuring an independent and possibly more reliable

milk supply than could be otherwise obtained.

We offer these suggestions for what they are worth. There is certainly great need of an infectious diseases Hospital, and the need may any day become still more urgent. It would seem, too, that the means are mainly at hand to supply this great want.

Referring to the subject of ventilation we desire to direct attention to the need of changing the air in our church buildings after each service. Where a service is held in the morning and a Sunday School in the afternoon, each attended by hundreds, all the air in the edifice is breathed over and over again. It has had its life-giving qualities extracted and noxious elements imparted to it, and is utterly unfit for further use. If the windows are not in the meantime opened, the larger congregation who assemble in the evening are compelled to breathe the impure air, with the result that many persons suffer from headaches, others from drowsiness and all in one way or another. In the cold season the duty of changing the air in our churches is much neglected, mainly for the reason that it lowers the temperature. The matter is more important than perhaps it may seem to be.

The School Board very properly returns thanks to Dr. Taylor for instituting the prize competitions on the subject of school ventilation and generously providing the money prizes for the successful competitors. The competition was an inspiring as well as an informing one, and has doubtless led both teachers and pupils to read and reflect more than they would otherwise have done on this important subject. The published essays have gone abroad through the city and country districts and must have produced impressions which may be relied upon to bear fruit in years to come. An intelligent public will join very heartily in endorsing the thanks tendered to Dr. Taylor.


