LONDON'S VITAL STATISTICS.

LONDON, April 13.—Some interesting points are found in the annual report of the registrar general of births, deaths and marriages of the United Kingdom. In 1899 the marriages reached the highest number recorded since 1870, aggregating 202,334 or 16.5 per thousand, and there were 37,124 illegitimate children born, the deaths numbered 581,790, equal to 16.6 per thousand, and there were 2,844 suicides. This is the first year on record that not a single death from hydrophobia has been reported.
