**SPECIAL MEETING.**—The Southern Teachers' Association met in a special session on Saturday, March 27th, at 11 a. m. The attendance was large and though the weather conditions were not specially favourable those teachers who see their need of help and were within reasonable distance persevered and were well repaid for their effort. The meeting was called particularly to discuss and supplement the programme of the Convention the Association are holding on April 16th and 17th. The officers and executive are introducing a precedent in the form of having every school in the Insular represented by an exhibit of school work from each. This will no doubt prove a success as scores of ideas will suggest themselves to teachers examining those. The order of procedure will contain speeches, papers, discussions and talks by the leading educational men of the province. The next item of the meeting was a paper on the subject "Physical Exercise in the Schools" by C. McGuigan, of Johnston's River. Mr. McGuigan, in select words drew out of this subject more valuable points than the majority of teachers were aware of being contained in it. He first set at naught the idea that the average pupil has physical exercises in abundance without that being added to by a course specially prescribed for that purpose. The syllabus as laid down provides for an all-round development and the bonus labour often results in round shoulders, an unseemly manner of walking and many undeveloped muscles. The speaker also showed the value of this course in developing the power of memory, the art of reasoning quickly and the all-important virtue of instant obedience to authority. Many complimentary remarks were tendered the speaker referring to the benefit and pleasure of listening to this paper. The program committee reported and the Question Box was emptied after which the President declared the meeting adjourned to meet again on April 16th in annual convention.

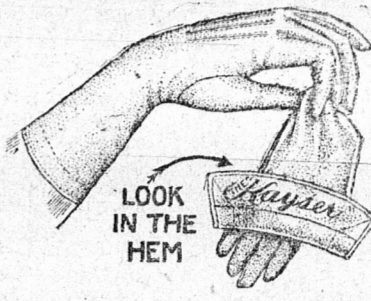

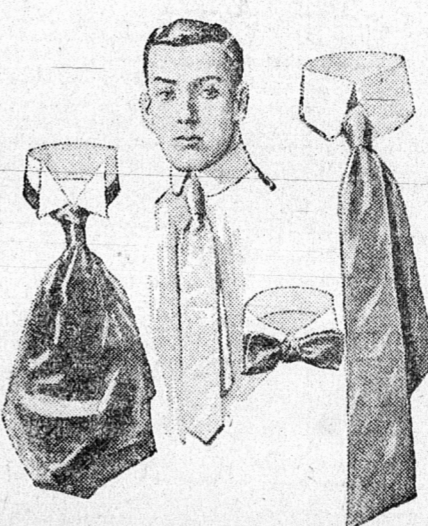

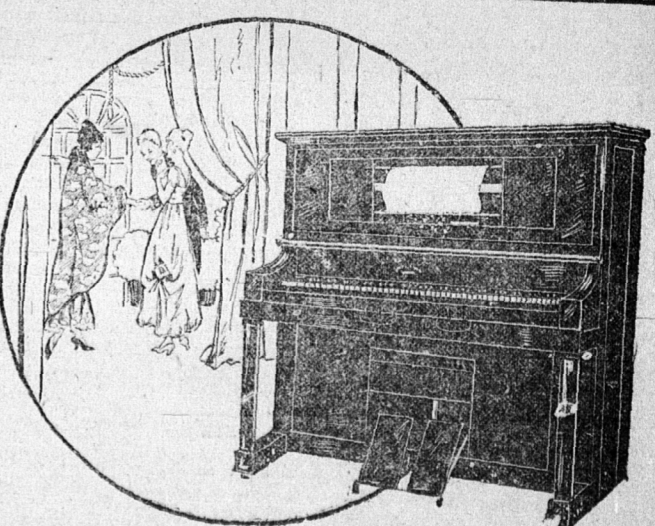
