LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

FRIDAY April 3.

The House met yesterday at half-past eleven.

HON JOHN F. WHEAR moved the following resolution:—

Resolved that the charges made by The Guardian newspaper published in Charlottetown in the issues thereof of the second and third days of April instant which are hereto annexed and which allege a breach of the privileges of this House be referred to a special committee of five to investigate and report upon immediately and that said committee have power to summon and examine witnesses on oath and to send for persons, papers and documents.

The mover in speaking to the resolution read the editorial articles from The Guardian of Thursday and Friday. He denied he was the paid agent of the Dominion Packing Company. He asked that the base and false rumors made by The Guardian should be referred to a special committee of the members of the House. Also, if a certain official of the House continued in his course he (Mr. Wear) would feel called upon to move for his dismissal.

CAPTAIN READ in seconding the motion condemned the articles in question. The charges made had intended to intimidate every member of the House. The insinuation had gone forth that every member who intended to support the bill was paid. He wanted no Gammy or Pineau business, however, and he would not have such.

HON MR. GORDON pointed out that the course adopted by the Hon gentleman was an extraordinary one. The Premier is the one who should take the matter in hand. He was surprised that the gentleman who felt aggrieved should do so. If the Dominion Packing Company were such a great institution as has been said the Hon. gentleman should feel it an honor to have a newspaper connect him with it. In his opinion the leader should move the resolution, not the aggrieved one.

PREMIER PETERS contended that the course pursued was a proper one.

MR MCLEAN thought the action taken an extraordinary one. In the course of events the aggrieved member would be the chairman of the committee and report back to the House—really the judge in his own case.

The Premier contended the course was a proper one. He would not see a member of his government charged with being a paid promoter.

MR MATHISON pointed out where the honorable member had gone beyond his rights. He could lay his case before the House and the House could take action. Freedom of utterance must be maintained in the public press. He was sorry to hear a threat against an official in the employ of the House. The mover of the resolution has said if he (the official) does not hold his tongue he will have him "fired." It does not lie with the Hon gentlemen or even the Government to dismiss him. It lies with the whole House.

HON MR CUMBERBY said the aggrieved member had taken the proper steps according to parliamentary procedure. He quoted from May in proof of his contention.

MR. McLAUGHLIN wanted to know the scope of the committee. He felt very doubtful about the question. In previous occasions his sentiments had been simply misrepresented by the political papers, and it was to the Guardian he went and sought justice. He was very reluctant subjecting the Editor of an independent paper to any indignity.

MR. PETERS was of the opinion that the resolution was rather vague. It should be more definite.

MR. CURRIE thought the attempt to "gag" an official of the House who was also a representative of a large section of the city should be condemned.

HON. MR. ROGERS contended that the motion was in the interests of the whole House because, if not prevented, these statements could be made against one member after another.

The motion carried. PREMIER PETERS moved that the special committee be composed of the following:—

Hon. Mr. Rogers, Mr. Read, Mr. Simpson, Mr. Manson, Mr. McLean.

JAMES E. McDONALD asked the Commissioner of Public Works if it is the intention of the Government to repair the Government Wharf at Bridgetown, Grand River during the present season.
