COINS WERE NOT COUNTERFEIT.

MONTREAL, March 31.—It appears as if a great many people have been giving themselves a needless amount of trouble during the past three weeks in watching for counterfeit coins, giving the alleged bad money back to those who gave it, and working off what they had themselves taken.

Specimens of the "spurious" currency were sent to Ottawa the Savings Bank and the assurance has been given from there that the money is perfectly good, being from the most up-to-date die used in the mint.

The scare had its origin in River-side, Albert county, N. B., where several coins were received by the bank which were regarded with suspicion. They were branded as counterfeits, and when a great number of their type commenced to turn up and be noticed, the existence of a counterfeiters' den in the province was suspected, and the suspicion developed so much of the nature of certainty that it was announced that the den was located in Amherst (N. S.).

The coins in question were all ten-cent pieces and quarters. By the banks they were suspected because of a rather unusual kind of lustre and because they seemed a little thinner than the ordinary and rang a little "dead" when thrown down. Their good workmanship in fineness of die and milling was remarked upon, however. Outside of the banks a peculiar method of testing prevailed which quickly condemned all coins of the new issue. It was said that the counterfeiters, when stood on edge, had the letters of denomination and the King's crown both at the top of the coin. In almost any collection of coins, there were found a large percentage which pronounced themselves "valueless" on this test, and in those places where it prevailed a great deal of time and energy was wasted in identifying counterfeiters.

Arthur McDonald, manager of the Bank of New Brunswick, said yesterday that there need be no apprehension as to the presence of counterfeit ten-cent pieces and quarters, as those suspected had been all of the type of those identified at Ottawa as good.

RAILWAY COMMISSION TO CONTROL CABLE RATES OF LINES IN CANADA.

OTTAWA, April 2.—One of the most important bills of the present session was put through the Canadian commons last night by Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux, P. M. G., when the bill to give the railway commission control of the rates and facilities of cable companies was passed. The postmaster general explained that while personally he had been in favor of the laying of a cable across the Atlantic by the government, he had found when he went to London that the number of shareholders in the cable companies was so great that strong objection would be taken to the government laying a cable.

The measure as passed last night by the commons brings not only the cable companies operating between Great Britain and Canada and all other cable companies touching Canadian territory under the control of the railway commission, but also cable companies operating in conjunction with telegraph companies.

Synopsis of Canadian North west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on an arm of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may present a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$300 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.

SAYS GRAND TRUNK PROMISED TRANS-ATLANTIC SERVICE TO PROVIDENCE.

MONTREAL, March 31.—Vice-President Benjamin Campbell, of the New York, New Haven & Hartford railway, who was in Montreal today, was asked regarding the Grand Trunk's proposed extension into Providence, and in particular as to whether the Grand Trunk had promised to establish a trans-Atlantic service from Providence.

Mr. Campbell stated that such a promise was made by the Grand Trunk's legal representative, Mr. Murdoch, at the hearing before the Rhode Island legislature for consideration of the charter applied for by the Grand Trunk. He understood the promise to be, in substantial effect, a consideration offered by the Grand Trunk in return for a grant of their charter.

Mr. Campbell was asked if the Grand Trunk did not have access to a good harbor at New London, as well as in Portland (Me.), to which he replied affirmatively, adding, however, that the Grand Trunk evidently felt it to be necessary or desirable to bargain to establish a trans-Atlantic line from Providence as a consideration to induce the granting of the charter.

Mr. Campbell, when asked what traffic was available through Providence to support a trans-Atlantic line operated by the Grand Trunk, replied that there would be considerable quantities of raw material imported for New England factories, and for Canadian ports, but the main support for such a line, must, if necessary, come from the grain traffic, large quantities of which the Grand Trunk would not doubt be able to control when its system west of Winnipeg becomes thoroughly entrenched in the grain areas. The establishment of a trans-Atlantic steamship line from Providence would serve to contribute business to the Central Vermont and help to make that line less burdensome for the Grand Trunk to carry.
