LONDON, July 28 — (Reuters) — Severe "earth tremors" reported tonight from Britain's southern counties of Cornwall and Devon were found later to have been caused by the explosion of the 7,176-ton Norwegian nitrate ship Ocean Liberty at Brest, in North-west France.
