British Expeditionary Forces arrived on time.

Seven Miles of Junk  
 I remembered that clearly, and it was of help to me, for here I had a situation vaguely similar to the British War problem. Across the continent stretched more than 22,000 miles of railways, too vast a project to lie under the responsibility of one man at even a central point. It could be handled best, I believed, in the relation of the War Office to the railway-executive committee; so I followed that system. I cut the Canadian National into four sections—an Atlantic Region, a Western Region and one for the Grand Trunk Western lines operating in to Michigan, Indiana and Illinois. I put each under the command of a general manager with as much power as though he owned the line, as long as he held to the efficiency demanded of all lines. He had assistants—his general superintendents—and under them, operating divisions in charge of superintendents. He was responsible to me alone. The plan worked as well as it did in England.

A description follows of a pleasant visit to Cavendish and the "Lake of Shining Waters." As an enthusiastic student of Carlyle Miss De Soyres was also greatly interested in the history of Margaret Gordon, a native of Charlottetown, who was Carlyle's first love and whom he immortalized as "Blumine" in "Sartor Restarus."

The fox farming industry, the agricultural productivity of the province, the freedom from unemployment and other troubles incident to larger centres are touched up. Miss De Soyres concludes:

"It is understandable why the sons and daughters of Prince Edward Island feel no inclination to leave their beloved province. And with the excellent facilities offered to tourists, through the energetic efforts of Mr. and Mrs. McFadyen, who are in charge of this work at present, it is likely that the 'Garden of the Gulf' will not enjoy its delicious isolation much longer, now that access to it has become easy and knowledge about its beauty is more widespread. And yet one selfishly wishes that its beauty could remain unspoiled and undiscovered for years to come, and only visited by those lovers of solitude able to appreciate its peculiar charm. But fortunately there are 7,000 miles of roads, so probably any fear of congested traffic is still a remote possibility."
