"Did you miss mother, darling?" "Oh, yes. But I played with Barbara and Helen."

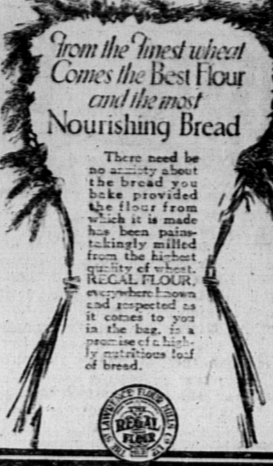
Sally's lips curled into a smile. How much after all had Marjorie missed her? Was a child worth a sacrifice? Would she be glad in the years to come?
