Plans To Enlarge Home Front Army

WINNIPEG, Oct. 14 — (CP) — Maj. Gen. B. W. Browne, director-general of the reserve army in Canada, in an interview here today discussed plans to make the reserve army a mighty home-front force.

"There are two main proposals being considered — compulsory reserve service for rejected draft men; close alliance between the school-cadet corps and the reserve army."

Speaking of compulsory service, Gen. Browne said: "It might come into effect if we can get a workable scheme. It will not be as easy as it sounds, but I think it is very likely it will be introduced."

He said school cadet units would be more closely allied with the reserve army.

"Plans for this are about completed, I think, and I expect an announcement from Ottawa very soon."

He added that "everyone must take stock of their personal war effort — there still is an urgent need for men."
