"SPUDS IS SPUDS"

AROUND OTTAWA
 ST. JOHN, Dec. 17.—The famous aphorism "pigs is pigs," seems to be rivaled by the dictate of the Dominion entomologist at Ottawa, that "spuds is spuds." A few days ago two carloads of Oregon pine arrived in St. John for the use of the dredges here. The timber was to be used for the uprights, known as spuds, which anchor the dredges in position when they are at work, and they were needed at once. They were held up at the border by the customs officials, under the rule that all timber must be inspected to guard against brown tail moths and other invaders before being admitted. To overcome this difficulty the local collector of customs wired Ottawa explaining that two carloads of spuds were required for immediate use on the dredges and asking that permission be given to waive the inspection. Today the reply came, "Deliver potatoes to dredges. No fear of inspection."

NEWEST DEVELOPMENT IN WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY EXHIBITED

LONDON, December 17.—The newest development in wireless telegraphy was demonstrated at the exhibition of the physical Society of London yesterday. This invention aims at the detection of the direction from which a message comes.

No one has yet discovered how to send wireless rays, like a searchlight in any definite direction. They go out everywhere, but even though they cannot be directed, it is just possible that a ship will be able to find out whence they came. This is done by a wonderful new instrument shown by the Marconi Company yesterday.

TOMATO JELLY SALAD

Take a can of tomatoes, strain, and mash through a colander. Put the juice in a saucepan and bring to the boiling-point. Then remove from fire and strain again through a piece of cheesecloth. Mix the juice with half a box of instantaneous gelatin dissolved in half a cup of water. Then season with paprika and salt. Pour in jelly moulds and put on ice to cool and serve on lettuce leaves with a rich mayonnaise dressing.

ESCALLOPED TURNIPS

Take five or six white turnips according to number of people to be served, wash carefully and parboil until they are tender, usually about half an hour. Then cut in small blocks or dice and put in buttered baking-dish in which a layer of bread-crumbs has been placed. Cover with sauce and sprinkle with bread-crumbs. Add a little grated cheese, then brown in the oven, modern prissilla.
