MONTREAL, July 22.—Steamship companies doing business to the St. Lawrence, comprising the North Atlantic conference, have increased rates \$5.00 per ton on inward traffic on weights between two and six tons over six tons special rates. This is to cover port expenses.

HURRICANE DOES MUCH DAMAGE.

HOUSTON, Texas, July 23.—Eighteen persons dead, eighteen seriously hurt and property loss, exceeding a million dollars is the toll exacted by yesterday's hurricane along the Louisiana and Texas coasts. Details of the disaster in the storm swept district are still meagre as the wires were stripped from the poles and railway communication continues impossible.
