That Car Of Yours

By WILLIAM ULLMAN Hear-to-Hear Talks With Automobile Owners and Drivers on How to Get the Most Out of Their Cars at the Least Expense.

KEEP TIMING ACCURATE.

Incorrect timing of the spark usually is associated with car performance that is below par. That is true, of course, but the more important fact often overlooked is that correct timing is a large factor in preventing engine wear.

REPLACE OLD BUSHINGS

It is important to keep watch on spring bolt bushings. Old and worn bushings should be replaced, not only because looseness in the spring eyes and bolts causes an annoying noise but also because play in these parts means exceptionally rapid wear.

FINDING SHORT CIRCUITS.

To find a short circuit in the light wiring that is not otherwise apparent, disconnect the negative terminal of the battery and attach to the post of one of the test lamp wires.

KEEP WIRE WHEELS TRUE.

With wire coming back into considerable vogue, motorists who are not accustomed to this variety of wheel, should realize that it is particularly important to keep them true.

RACING ENGINE NO TEST.

Many motorists and mechanics when they have finished some major or minor repair work on the engine will race it. No useful purpose is served by this action.

REMOVE PAINT REMOVER.

John Smith and His Car

My FREDERICK O. RUSSELL John Smith is a character whose every motorist should welcome. He is not selfish, rather he is a motorist's enemy.

SHIFTING GEARS QUIETLY.

"This really is a fine car, but why do you handicap it by old-fashioned driving?" I asked Smith the other day as we were running downtown in his new machine.

"You seem to have lost all conception of the relationship between engine and car speeds," I told him. "Without this knowledge, you cannot hope to shift gears properly."

"It would pay you to take an hour off to become familiar with the engine. You should learn to operate it as a stationary power plant before trying to drive the car."

"Now that illustrates my point," I told him. "You didn't match up the speed of the engine with that of the car to bring the gears into proper mesh. One of them was revolving too slowly."

"At this juncture, I painted for him a picture of the transmission gears. When the clutch is engaged, the engine shaft rotates the clutch shaft.

"When you were running in high gear a few minutes ago," I explained to him, "the front sliding gear was pushed all the way forward until it locked with the main driving gear. That joined the otherwise separate parts of this upper shaft and gave you direct drive."

"This simply is the old principle of leverage applied to gearing and to the modern automobile. When you shifted, you were faced with the problem of bringing these intermediate gears into noiseless mesh."
