Gifts of stock to stockholders does not increase the value of a company's assets, nor advances in wages unequal to advances in the cost of living better the position of labor. As yet there is no indication of such happenings, yet, eventually, all this will undermine existing conditions and have its influence.

For two months past prices, as a whole, have made no move of importance either up or down, and at this time, the factors to influence prices seem fairly evenly balanced. What is the market waiting for? Perhaps until a more definite insight is to be had into the political situation,—but, more likely, because, notwithstanding the seers and soothsayers, it is too early to make a reasonably accurate estimate of what can be expected this year from the crops. At this early date an estimate of crop conditions is pure guesswork.

A waiting market often moves in an erratic manner and advances or declines in special more or less insignificant issues is without importance. In my opinion, caution is the keynote at the present time.

The low and even rate for money both at home and in all the important money centres abroad would seem to indicate a world-wide hesitancy in industrial and commercial conditions. Rates being higher on the Continent than at home, there is no disposition on the part of bankers to withdraw our European balance.

**THE BOND MARKET.**

Short time notes yielding a high rate of income are in demand. Otherwise the bond market is dull and underwriters are encountering difficulties in disposing of the issues taken a month ago. There is little European demand, even at high rates, for our securities. Offerings are extensive and at prices to yield from 4 1/2 to 5 p. c. Country bankers are buying modestly.

**THE STOCK MARKET.**

The market will undoubtedly be forced to yield moderately to recent political happenings. However, the new financing proposed by the U. S. Rubber Company and the settlement of the labor troubles in the anthracite coal districts have been the factors of importance to prices this week. When contrasted, these two events would seem to indicate that we are building a house of cards, which inevitably must fall and bring about a readjustment of conditions.
