A meeting of the Northern Branch of the Farmers' Institute held in New Glasgow Hall on Jan. 28th was well attended to hear Prof. Theodore Russ deliver an address on winter dairying. Mr. Ross first called the attention of the farmers to the valuable information they can so easily receive from the Bulletin published by the various agricultural departments, on Canadian sheep, husbandry, hog raising, cow-testing etc. Mr. Ross then stated that it is the duty of the farmer from a moral as well as a financial standpoint to husband the resources of his land and that the production of cheese and butter there is practically no loss in fertility, in selling one load of oats we have more fertility than we would in selling one hundred tons of cheese and butter. Mr. Ross said the average production of milk on the island per cow is less than 3000 lbs a year. This is from want of proper care and sufficient food. A well fed Holstein cow he believed to be the most profitable in dairying. In the line of dairying we Canadians have much to learn in competition in the British markets with Denmark. We lost eight million dollars on the same quantity of products notwithstanding our superior soil and climate. At the close of the address, remarks were made by Leonard Clarke, Charles Dickson, Oliver C. LePage, William Laird, Walter Buntain and C. A. Stevenson, complimenting Mr. Ross on his interesting and instructive address. The meeting then tendered Mr. Ross a hearty vote of thanks.
