mittee, it was agreed that it would be well to have one or two representatives in every congregation whose duty it would be to take up the question of the work of the Summer School and Missionary Conference, and to try to get in touch with all of the young people and see that they each can have an opportunity of attending if they so desire.

A list of thirty-six representatives of twenty-seven preaching places throughout the Presbytery was then submitted and agreed to. Then at the closing meeting of the Summer School and Missionary Conference the following resolution was submitted: "That whereas from time to time during the week the various leaders who came to assist in the work of the School had been thanked for the part taken by them; be it therefore resolved that at this closing meeting of all, that the thanks of all of the students and other leaders of the Summer School and Missionary Conference be extended to the Rev. R. Hensley Stavert for his untiring efforts in making the School such a splendid success.

"And be it further resolved that the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island be asked to place on record the fact of the whole-hearted appreciation of the students and the other leaders of the School now being extended to Mr. Stavert for his great work in its behalf."

The motion was carried unanimously, and the vote of thanks was conveyed to Mr. Stavert by Dr. F. S. V. Bruce-Williams.

The question of the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island securing a camp site on which to hold their Summer Schools and Missionary Conferences in the future was taken up and discussed. All the members of the Presbytery felt that some site in a central part of the Island on the South Shore and as near to the railway as possible should be purchased by the Presbytery. The Moderator of Presbytery, Rev. Quincey A. McDowell,

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all, the Clerk of Presbytery, Rev. R. Hensley Stavert and Rev. M. Scott Fulton were appointed as a committee to look into this question of securing a suitable site and were asked to report at the March meeting of Presbytery.

Rev. R. Hensley Stavert gave a brief report of the work done by the several students in the various fields in the past summer. Within the bounds of the Presbytery eight students were employed by eight mission fields, made up of one or more preaching places. These were as follows, with the students supplying each: Alberton—R. C. Archer; West Point—Jas. McGowan; Tynes Valley, Freeland, Victoria West and Lot 14—H. A. Doig; Clifton, Long River, French River, and Granville—John Fleck. Bradabane, Rose Valley, North Rustico, were supplied by Schurman Yeo, and also Clyde River part of the time; Tryon, Borden and Hampton—Edwin White; Wood Islands and Wood Islands East—Roy Blair, and Murray Harbor North and Peter's Road by Jos. E. Pringle and Murray Harbor South by Rev. Quincey A. McDowell.

The work done by the students was of high order and the most of these fields were able to meet the expenses of the summer's work in full. In the majority of all of these

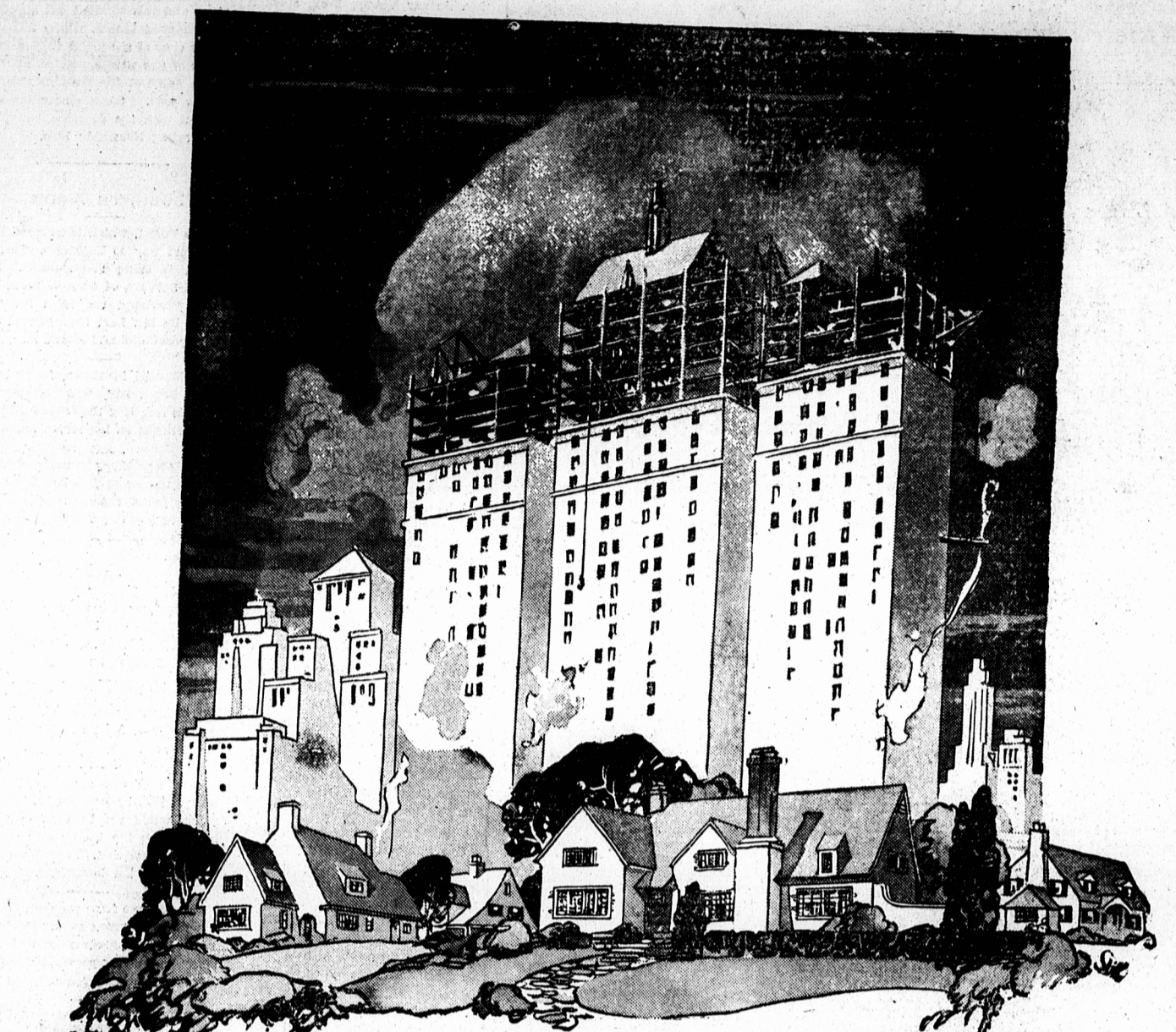
preaching places the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was dispensed by the interim moderator of these various fields or by some one acting in their stead, when for some reason they were not able to be present. At Tynes Valley, Freeland, Lot 14, and West Point the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was dispensed by the Rev. Chas. J. St. Clair Jeans. At Long River, French River, Tryon, Bradabane and Clyde River, by Rev. R. Hensley Stavert. At Clifton by Rev. Fred Williamson, acting in Mr. Stavert's stead; and at Granville by Rev. Thos. A. Rodger, acting for Mr. Stavert. At Wood Islands by Rev. R. Hensley Stavert acting for Mr. Rodger. At Murray Harbor North and Murray Harbor South by Rev. Quincey A. McDowell.

Besides the eight students, Rev. M. E. Genge, D.D., served the pastoral charge of Marshfield, Harrington and Mt. Stewart as stated supply, and Dr. F. S. V. Bruce-Williams served the congregation of Montague, also as stated supply. At Marshfield, Harrington and Mt. Stewart the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was dispensed by Rev. W. Bruce Muir, and at Montague by Rev. Quincey A. McDowell. At some of these communion services quite large numbers of new members were received into full communion with the Presbyterian Church in Canada. Among them were Mr. Stewart, where eighteen new mem-

bers were received; Wood Islands ten; Freeland, eight; Marshfield five; Clyde River, five; Tryon, four, and others with a smaller number each. Quite a large number of children were also baptized in these various fields within the past few months. During the past year three more Elders were ordained at Marshfield by Rev. W. Bruce Muir; three more at Tryon by Rev. R. Hensley Stavert, and three more at Murray Harbor North by Rev. Quincey A. McDowell. The past year throughout has indeed been a successful one among the various home mission fields within

the bounds of the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island. Rev. Chas. J. St. Clair Jeans was then unanimously elected moderator of the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island for the ensuing year. On retiring from the moderatorship, Rev. Quincey A. McDowell thanked the members of Presbytery for the way in which they had assisted him in making the duties of this office for the past year so pleasant. After having spent a year in the moderator's chair, he gave it as his impression that it would help promote the work of the Church to

have more Presbyterial visitation than we have had thus far. He felt that it would do a great deal good to hold from time to time series of evangelistic sermons in different congregations, and he stressed the need of more prayer—more waiting upon Christ as strength in carrying on the work of His Church. The Presbytery then adjourned at the call of the Moderator a Clerk, of which public intimation was given and the meeting was closed with the benedictions by the Moderator, Rev. Quincey A. McDowell.



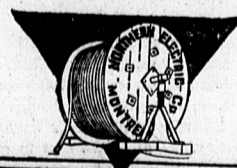
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
