## KING GEORGE HAD CHAT WITH A LEPER

LONDON, Aug. 20.—The first public appearance of King George and Queen Mary since their accession to the throne, was an interesting occasion. The scenes in the street were extraordinary and unprecedented. Certainly no other monarch could have made such a royal progress in any other capital in Europe. A few hundred police to keep the way clear, a score of soldiers to act as an escort, and two plain carriages—that was all. Yet all the way along the route there were the dense crowds, who stood and waited in the hot July sunshine for the chance of greeting their King and Queen. There was the usual quaint ceremony at the city boundary, where the Lord Mayor attended to surrender the city sword to the King and receive it back again. The Lord Mayor was attended by the sheriffs and aldermen, and the civic ceremony was soon gone through.

All through the city their Majesties met with the most cordial welcome, but it was not until White-chapel Church was reached that the real significance of the occasion became apparent. Long before the time for the passing of the Royal procession people began to gather on the footways.

### A WONDERFUL CROWD.

It was a crowd the like of which could be matched nowhere else. All the nations of Europe had contributed to it. The persecuted and the oppressed of all the world had representatives there. Thousands of Jews lined the footways, with their children, well-cared for, and decently dressed. There were picturesque old "schmorrers," with flowing beards and shiny broadcloth coats. Russians, Poles, Lithuanians, Esths and Slavs discussed the coming of the King and Queen in their various dialects. And there were men whose lives had been soured by ages of oppression and tyranny, and who in their own land would have met the coming of Royalty with a scowl of hate and curses—and it may be with something worse. But on Saturday they greeted the Sovereigns of their adopted country with respect and enthusiasm. Could there be a finer tribute to the stability and worth of the English monarchy?

Inside the hospital all was ready for the arrival of their Majesties. On the lawn had been grouped all the convalescent cases who were fit to be moved. In the balconies overlooking the garden were more of the patients. In the centre a bevy of the nursing sisters were grouped around the statue of Queen Alexandra, each in her pretty uniform of blue and white.

### CHATS WITH PATIENTS.

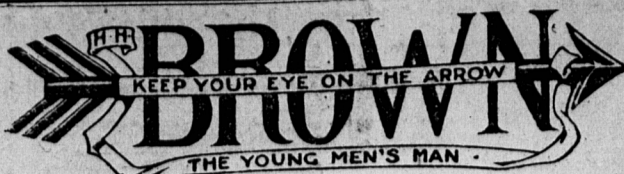
The King and Queen were accompanied by Princess Mary, and they walked on to the lawn, where the convalescents were waiting. The Queen's face lighted up with womanly sympathy as she stopped and spoke to three little ones who were lying out in the sun. "Are you getting on all right? It is nice lying out here." Her Majesty said to one little fellow, and the boy looked up in wondering astonishment at the queenly figure that was bending over him.

Down the line the Royal visitors passed, giving a word and a smile to one and another of the patients. One little chap, in a red jersey, had just undergone an operation for a cataract. Another patient held him upon his shoulder, "Is that the King?" he asked.

A little fellow who two days ago was ordered away to a convalescent home absolutely declined to go until the King and Queen had been to the hospital. His repeated requests were finally granted. Conversing with the little fellow, who had been run over in the street, and was suffering from a broken leg, the King asked him if he was playing the game. "The last across." The little fellow pleaded his innocence.

### CHATTED WITH LEPER.

At the end of the line was seated a young Russian named Turog, who came to the hospital about five weeks ago to be treated for what he thought was a cutaneous affection. In a short time his symptoms were diagnosed as those of leprosy. At the request of the local government board, he is being kept at the hospital, and consequently there is no danger to the other patients. The King had a talk with this man, saying that he knew a great deal about the disease of leprosy, having visited the Leprosy Settlement of Simon's Bay. The patient can feel nothing with his hands and His Majesty remarked that there was at least this comfort, that he did not suffer pain. This is the first case of leprosy that has ever been
