PROVINCIAL ACCOUNTS.

The annual report of the Provincial Auditor on the public accounts of the Province has been received by the press. The balance sheet for the year ended 31st December last shows that the balance against the Province has been increased from \$138,736.77 to \$207,925.46, or by \$71,163.61.

If a farmer builds a house costing \$1500 or a barn costing \$500 he knows there is a difference between such expenditure and the ordinary living expenses of the year. He is not necessarily poorer for having built a new house or barn, even if he has borrowed the money to pay for it.

The first four items in the above account and making up the great bulk of the account, are quite properly chargeable to capital as they represent permanent investments outside of the ordinary transactions of the year.

Coming to the ordinary transactions of the year the receipts were \$282,056.07 and the expenditures \$308,494.49, showing an excess of expenditure amounting to \$26,438.42. This would show the true deficit for the year if all the charges to capital account were such charges as should have been made.

Undoubtedly our provincial income is far too small for our requirements, and some means must be devised to obtain an increase, or otherwise there must be a resolute curtailment of expenditure in order to restore the equilibrium between receipts and outlays.

Turning to the expenditure side of the account the amount expended by the Government directly for education is quite out of proportion to what the Government of any Province expends for that purpose. Last year this charge was \$129,113, or more than twice the total sum contributed directly to the revenue of the Province by the people of the Province.

The other larger items of the provincial expenditure were last year the administration of justice, the insane hospital, interest on the public debt, ferries and ferry steamers, roads and bridges, yet all these taken together make a less total than the outlay for education.
