MAY BE GUILLOTINED.

LONDON, June 7—The Home Rule bill will be taken up in committee, clause by clause, June 17. The interest will be filled not merely by pressing forward the necessary business of supply, but by paying the way for the committee stage of the Home Rule bill by passing a comprehensive guillotine resolution, euphemistically described as a time-table.

Ministers have under consideration various expedients for keeping the committee stage within reasonable time limits, including the kangaroo closure and fixing a day for closing the committee stage, leaving the House to deal as it likes with the clauses in the interim. It is thought now, however, that it would be better to set up a time-table before taking

even the first clauses, and allot a specified number of sittings to the various sections of the measure, proceedings which the Unionists, of course, will strenuously oppose.

Premier Asquith and Sir Edward Grey had decided at the beginning of the session to give the House of Lords another opportunity to pass the naval prize bill, which it threw out last year but it seems unlikely with all government time heavily mortgaged, that the Prime Minister will be able to give effect to his original determination. A drastic guillotine scheme might facilitate the passing of the measure through the Commons, but the cabinet hesitates to follow this course, believing that it would provide the Lords with a badly needed excuse for again rejecting the bill.

TOITURED BY FLIES.

FRENCH RIVER, Ont., June 8—After wandering for seven days, tortured by black flies, without food or shelter, James Belanger, a Frenchman, was found exhausted nine miles east of here yesterday. THE BOSTON STRIKE.

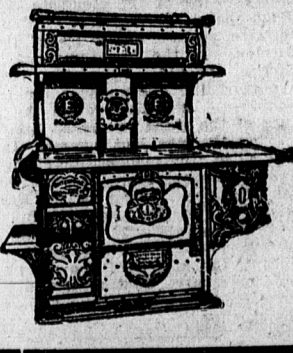
