The Strikers Overpower the Police and Chase Them From the Ships and the Docks

A Striker is Shot in the Leg and his Assailant is Arrested. The Victoria Rifles Unable to Restrain the Mob and the Hussars are Called Upon for Aid—Teamsters also to go out.

THE POLICE OVERPOWERED. MONTREAL, April 29.—(Special)—On Tuesday afternoon a mob of six-hundred strikers overpowered the small force of the police at the wharves and that were about the steamers where the non-union men were working and chased them ashore.
