STOCK QUOTATIONS

The Market At A Glance

NEW YORK April 14 — (AP) — A handful of specialties behaved fairly well in today's stock market but the general run of leaders did little either way. The Associated Press 60-stock average was unchanged at 51.9. The market lacked breadth. Transfers of 477,200 shares were the smallest for a full session since Oct. 14 and compared with 659,500 Thursday.

MONTREAL April 14 — (CP) — Part of the list boarded today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market — utilities and papers — were moved up in the indices after a general two-day weak spell. Industrials and goods remained on uneasy side.

Posting small gains in utilities were Montreal Power, Shawinigan, Power Corporation common and second preferred, International Utilities "A" and Gasline. Montreal Railway slipped. Steamship and C.P.R. did better in carriers and provincial transport edged back.

TORONTO April 14 — (CP) — Stocks drifted downward on the Toronto Market today to record index losses for all groups. Bear exploration rights expired at the close of the market today. The final sale through was 100,000 shares. Bear stock weakened a cent to 71. Anglo-Huronian dropped 20 cents to 6.20 and losses of 10 cents were noted in the gold group by Cochenour, Williams, Carr, Giant Yellowknife, Kerr-Adrian, McIntyre, Farnour, O'Brien, Pickle, Crow, Preston, Sylvanite and Tack Hughes. Dome and McIntyre firmed 1/2 to 1.

WINNIPEG April 14 — (CP) — Sales of No. 2 and 3 northern wheat to the United States commodity export corporation today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange are estimated at 1,000,000 bushels at the completion of trading. Wheat sales to the United States were placed at 250,000 bushels of No. 1 northern, cash price; No. 2, 1.92-1.94; No. 3, 1.88-1.90; other grades 51 1/2. Barley: 3 feed 63 1/2; other grades 64 1/2.

CHICAGO April 14 — (AP) — A good upturn in rye and barley futures prices today reported by trade imparted strength to other pits and all cereals closed with a strong upturn. The market was based on unconfirmed rumors that Canada may halt exports of barley to this country.
