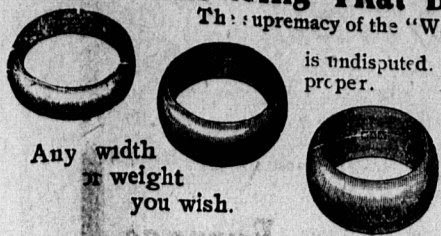

### CHRISTIAN SCIENTISTS.

VIRIDEN, Man., June 12.—Violet Irene Williams, aged 8, died on Monday, and the doctor, called after death, refused a certificate, necessitating an inquest on Friday and Saturday. The evidence indicated that death was caused by pleurisy in both lungs, and possibly inflammation.

Mrs. Macdonald and Mrs. Sprague, Christian Scientists, gave their system, and admitted having charged a dollar a visit, or \$5 weekly. The jury found death to be due to pleurisy, brought on by a chill caught in January, and that the father hastened the cause of death and was criminally responsible in not securing medical attention. The jury further found that the parent was influenced in his neglect by Mrs. McDougall and Mrs. Agnes Sprague, and the jury recommended the Attorney-General's Department to take action in the matter.
