TORONTO GLOBE ON THE HUDSON BAY RAILWAY.

The Toronto Globe, while staunchly supporting the general policy of the Liberal Government, has apparently grave doubts about the prudence of undertaking to build the projected railway to Hudson Bay. It sees the attractions which the project of a short cut to the Old World markets must have for the people of the Northwest, but is of opinion that they may have been too easily enchanted, too unmindful of the difficulties of constructing the road or of operating it when constructed.

employed when the Hudson's Bay route was closed? These are questions which practical men must answer. Answers have not been essayed so far as we know as yet. No individual or Government, we may presume, would undertake the construction of a railway to the bay until these various problems are intelligently dealt with and an answer sought to the final question, viz., under all the circumstances is it likely that there would be enough traffic on the northern part of the railway to meet the interest on the cost of construction and the expenses of operation?

"The dominant fact is that Hudson's Strait is ice-bound for the greater part of the year. Grain by that route could not go out for nine or ten months after it had been harvested. There can be no question that in order to have a season of navigation long enough to make the route a serious one vessels would have to fight their way in through the ice at the opening of the season and fight their way out at the close. It is not a bold assertion to say that every once in a while vessels would be caught in the ice and have to remain until released in the following year. That whole dreary and unprofitable coast would have to be supplied with lighthouses and light-housekeepers. Vessels intended for that route would have to be constructed with a special view to ice-fighting. Could such vessels be profitably

employed when the Hudson's Bay route was closed? These are questions which practical men must answer. Answers have not been essayed so far as we know as yet. No individual or Government, we may presume, would undertake the construction of a railway to the bay until these various problems are intelligently dealt with and an answer sought to the final question, viz., under all the circumstances is it likely that there would be enough traffic on the northern part of the railway to meet the interest on the cost of construction and the expenses of operation?

LORD KITCHENER'S VISIT TO CANADA.

It is said that Lord Kitchener is about to visit Canada, but in desirous of doing so in the quietest possible fashion. He has been called the greatest living general of the white races, that is, the greatest commander outside of Japan. He has recently visited Australia and was greatly pleased with the material for soldiers which he found there. He will find material about equally good in Canada, and no doubt he can give our military council and our generals

some valuable hints as to the best preparation for the defense and security of both the Dominion and the Empire. But he wishes to do all this in the most unostentatious manner possible. Lord Kitchener is not a show general. He is a commander who has done some things and has proved his capacity for great military usefulness in the future, should the occasion arise. Such men as Lord Roberts and he are a valuable imperial asset.

During the past year the Government of Quebec paid toward all educational purposes \$867,450. This will be increased by over \$80,000 during the current year. A new agricultural college, a school of forestry, new academies for boys and increased salaries for school inspectors are covered by the additional grant for this year. The school inspectors are to have their salaries raised to \$1400 each and they will be required to visit the schools twice a year, instead of once as formerly.

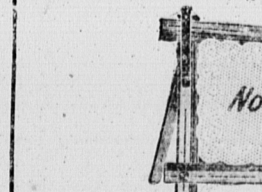
