Crush well about 2 quarts ripe berries. Measure 4 level cups (2 lbs.) of crushed berries into large kettle. Add 7 level cups (3 lbs.) sugar and mix well. Use hottest fire and stir constantly before and while boiling. Boil hard for one full minute. Remove from fire and stir in half bottle (scant 5c) CERTO.
