Presentation To Rev. R. H. Stavert At Bradalbane

On the evening of Thursday, February 24th, the Young People of the Presbyterian Church in Bradalbane, and vicinity, assembled at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Robert MacLeod, Bradalbane, for the purpose of expressing to Rev. R. H. Stavert their appreciation of his services among them during the past year and a half.

Shortly after all had arrived, Mr. Malcolm MacLeod was elected chairman, and in a few well chosen words stated the purpose of the gathering.

He then called upon Mr. Marshall Matheson, President of the Young People's Society, of the Presbyterian Church at Bradalbane, to give further reasons for the Young People having come together.

Sea Serpents Visit Howe's Sound Waters

VANCOUVER, B. C., May 2.—Two sea serpents said to be thirty feet long and able to raise their heads six feet above the surface of the water have driven all fish from the waters of Howe Sound off Gibson's Landing, 150 miles west of here, according to residents of the settlement and to Frederick Parnell, of Vancouver, who declared today that he and his brother obtained a close view of the creatures there last week-end.

Parnell said that he had been fishing without result from a row-boat near Gibson's Landing when the water suddenly broke within 25 feet of his small craft and two "serpents" reared their heads and neck above the surface, emitting air with a noise similar to that made by blackfish. He declared the heads as being two feet broad, with enormous mouths and bulging eyes. Loose pouches of skin hung from their lower jaws. Parnell said, and their necks of a pink color blotched with dull yellow, tapered before the heads, enlarging their bodies.

Parnell said that he at first remained motionless with terror at the sight, but recovered his nerve in a moment and called "look, quick," to his brother, George, on the nearby shore. Immediately the creatures disappeared beneath the surface.

Several other persons are reported to have seen the "serpents" in the same vicinity.

EGG LAYING CONTEST

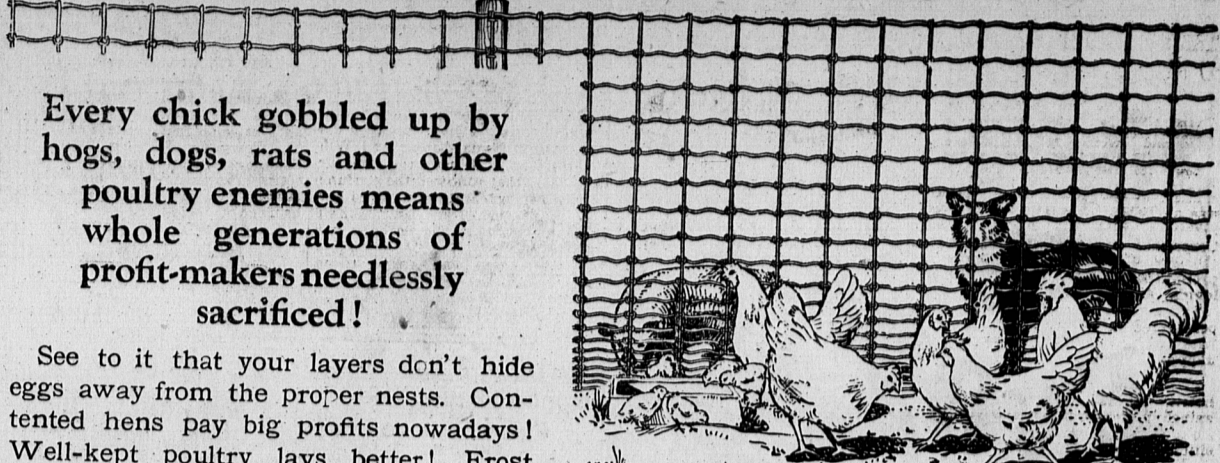
Notes on the P. E. Island Egg Laying Contest for the 25th Week Ending April 24th, 1927.

R. are 3rd with 52.7 points, 55 eggs; Mr. H. C. Muttart's B. R. are 4th, with 51.8 points, 46 eggs; Mr. Bert Brown's B. R. are 5th with 49.4 points, 46 eggs; Mrs. A. Hamilton's B. R. are 6th with 49.1 points, 44 eggs; Mr. W. W. Crosby's B. R. are 7th with 48.5 points, 51 eggs; Mr. M. Cutcliffe's B. R. are 8th with 48.2 points, 51 eggs; Mr. Harold Laird's B. R. are 9th with 47.5 points, 49 eggs, and Mr. Clifford McEwen's B. R. are 10th with 56.2 points, 49 eggs.
