This morning a party of about one hundred cadets from Charlottetown left by the Northumberland to attend the cadet camp at Aldershot, N. S. They were accompanied by Geo. H. Campbell and James Landriagan; West Kent having as its cadet captain, Ernest Weeks and Queen Square, Percy Landriagan. The boys will be absent six days.

During the visit of H. R. H. Duke of Connaught and party to Charlottetown, Cleveland Craswell secured several excellent photos of the party while en route from place to place. These were forwarded to Their Royal Highnesses at their request and Mr. Craswell has received from Capt. H. C. Buller, one of the Aides, a letter containing a duplicate order and also containing a personal expression of appreciation from H. R. H. Princess Patricia of a photo in colors of herself in a carriage.

Much sympathy was felt in Yarmouth among the Oddfellows in the Grand Lodge sessions over the illness of Grand Secretary J. J. McKinnon, Charlottetown. In his report Grand Master Craig specially thanked the secretary for his co-operation and assistance rendered in his official capacity and though unable to be present at the election of officers he was again appointed Grand Secretary, and also was further honored as will be noted in despatches elsewhere. His report as read at the Grand Lodge showed that the year has been a good one, both as regards the increase in membership as well as financially. Eight new subordinate lodges were instituted including Hillside, 123, at Montague P. E. I., and Regal, 124 at Kensington, P. E. I. There are several applications for lodges to be instituted shortly. The gain in membership for the year, exclusive of the new lodges, was 322, and adding the membership of the new lodges, the net gain is 542. Since 1908, when Mr. McKinnon took office as Grand Secretary, increase in membership has increased 25 per cent. The present number of lodges up to June 30, is 115, with a membership of 10,483, an increase of eight lodges and 542 members. The initiations during the year were 359, and admitted by card 106; reinstated 75, a total of 1,140. Withdrawn by card, deceased, etc, totalled 598. The amount of relief paid out during the year totalled \$16,298.19.

DR. J. G. SCHURMAN IS U. S. MINISTER TO GREECE

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13—The resignation of Mr. Moses created quite a stir among New England members of Congress here. Mr. Moses was for years editor of the Concord Monitor and was appointed Minister to Greece three years ago. He is a graduate of Dartmouth and his appointment was due largely to the influence of Senator Gallinger.

At that time Senator Gallinger was recognized as one of the most active of the "reactionaries" who fought the nomination of Mr. Taft in 1908. Supporters of the President complained of the Moses appointment at the time on the ground that he was a reactionary.

It developed today that Mr. Moses resigned two weeks ago. He gave as his reason that, while Greece was exceedingly attractive, he had received flattering offers in America he wanted
