ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

Rev. Hammond Johnson, well known in Charlottetown who last summer was ordained a minister by the N. B. and P. E. I. conference, which met at Sackville, was recently presented with an address and a dressing case by the Tabernacle Methodist Church of which he is a pastor.

P. S. Brown has received communication from A. L. Somers, Springhill, stating that it is proposed to hold races there July 1 and 2 and asking what entries might come from Charlottetown. The proposed events are 2.19 trot, 2.40 trot and pace. Free for all trot and pace, 2.25 Trot and pace.

The turn out of the steamer Newfoundland that was sent last winter to the rescue of the winter steamers, catch of seals was as follows: 10,500 young harps, 12 old harps, 6 young hoods, 12 old hoods; total—10,530. Gross weight 198 tons, 10 cwt 5 lbs. Net 181 tons, 5 cwt., 3 qtrs., 12 lbs. Value \$13,828.47. The crew of 173 men shared \$26.04 each.

The Guardian regrets that owing to an inadvertence in transmission of the message from Summerside the name of Conductor Thompson was accidentally inserted in place of Conductor Tanton who was in charge of the train conveying the Sons of England. Conductor Tanton is one of the most enthusiastic of the order and is as popular among his brethren there as he is in Railway circles.

Prof. Robertson, of Ottawa addressed the members of the New Brunswick Legislature Tuesday in the interests of manual training and consolidated schools. He advocated an increased expenditure for public schools particularly for consolidated schools and for special courses of instruction in the Normal School and University whereby farmers and other classes could have special instruction in fruit culture and other lines. He spoke in complimentary terms of the school system of the United States. He had recently visited the consolidated schools in Ohio and Iowa and their present status there more than justified the expectations of the friends of the system. He asked the Legislature to grant twenty thousand dollars per year towards the establishment of such courses as he had outlined in connection with the Normal School and University. The present system of education tended to take our sons out of the province. He advocated a system which would educate the head, the hand and the heart. The address was listened to with great attention by a large audience.

FREDERICTON NOTES.—The opening months of spring are passing away, and with it the white robes of an unusually severe winter Nature is gradually awakening from her long slumber and soon again will the grass and the wild flowers lead their beauty and fragrance to make perfect this most wonderful season of the year.—Refuge Division lives, and flourishes through every season, and these are no apparent ill effects from the powerful element that so effectually cut our Island off from the outside world for so many weeks during the last winter.—Excelsior Debating Society which was re-organized last fall was brought to a close on the evening of the 20th inst. Apples, oranges and confectionary in abundance were passed around and it is not necessary to state that this part of the program was thoroughly enjoyed. The meeting was brought to a close by singing God Save the King.

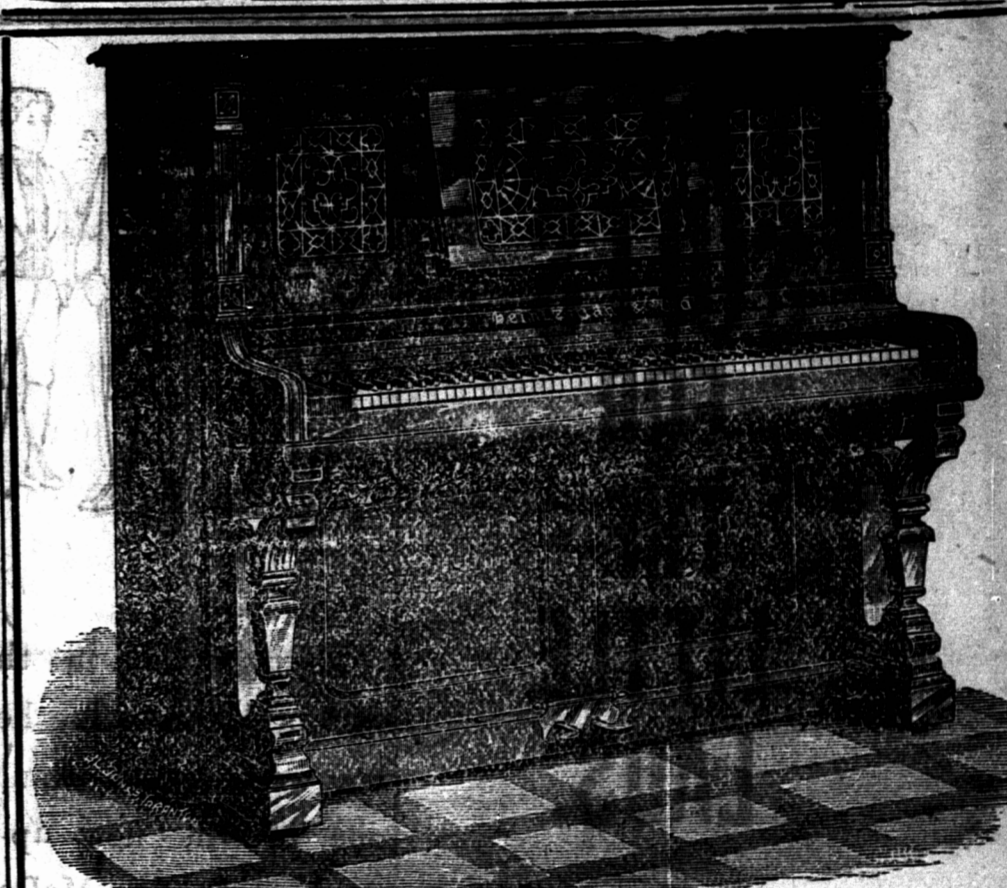
