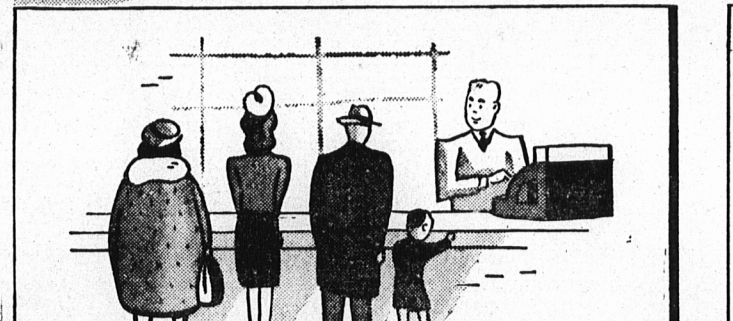

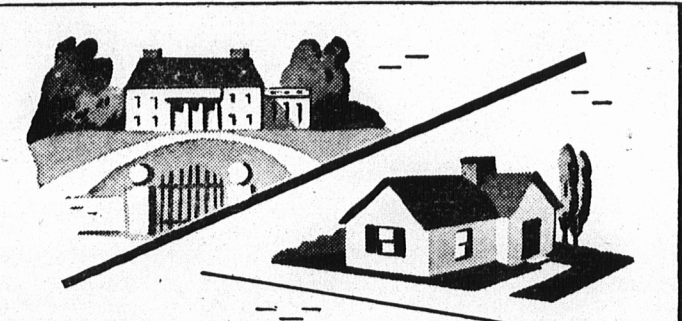

MONTREAL, Dec. 16—(CP)—There were 171 cattle, 74 sheep and lambs, 889 hogs, and 255 calves for sale on Montreal livestock markets today. Prices on all classes of livestock were steady to firm.

Cattle were mostly of common quality. Common butcher cows made \$4.50 to \$5. Canners and cutters \$3.25 to \$4.25. Common bulls \$4.50 to \$6.

Calves were firm. Veals were trading changes today on the stock exchange were narrow. Turnover was light.

Bullock furnished a feature by dropping 3 1-4 as news from the East Indies, where the company's mine fields are located, became unfavorable.

The Steel of Canada issues were softer spots in the industrial section, both losing more than a point. Others in the group weaker were the newprints, Bahurst and Dryden.

Shawinigan and Montreal Power did better in utilities but Quebec Power slipped. Canada Steamship common was fractionally harder in carriers and the preferred a loser. C.P.R. was erratic and finished in the hole.

International Nickel and Hollinger edged up in metals and Noranda was behind. Oglive preferred picked up three points and the common gave ground in miscellaneous and among others appearing Imperial Tobacco and Distillers-Seagram were headed up and Celanese down.

NEW YORK, Dec. 16—(AP)—The stock market pulled its recovery punches late today after scoring an assortment of selective advances in the forenoon.

Canadian stocks were mixed. Distillers Seagram, McIntyre Mines each gained 1-4; International Nickel, Walkers common, 1-2; Walkers pfd 5-8; and Hollinger 1-8. Dome Mines lost 1-4; Canadian Pacific, Imperial Oil, 1-8; Canadian Marconi 1-16; Brazilian Traction 1-2 and Ford "A" 1-8. Lake Shore Mines finished unchanged.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was off 1/4 of a point at 37. Tax selling in a number of low-priced issues expanded the day's volume to 1,225,533 shares compared with 1,110,340 Monday. It was the seventh consecutive full session in which turnover topped the million mark.
