Cape Breton Highlanders Leaving Ottawa a To Join 1st Can. Armoured Division

Nova Scotians Mourn Loss Of Traditional Highland Dress

The Cape Breton Highlanders, who have been sojourning in the Capital while sharpening up their machine-gun and rifle work at Connaught Ranges, are ready to join the 1st Canadian Armoured Division to start training for mechanized war.

The Nova Scotians leave Ottawa with mutual regrets. They have made host of friends while off duty, and a lasting impression on the public in their ceremonial parades and while mounting the Parliament Guard. In addition, the Highlanders realize that they are trading the country-club atmosphere and landscaped surroundings of their camp overlooking the Ottawa River for hard work and serious war training.

The Cape Bretons are already enured to the day following Canadian mobilization of war. They patrolled the shores of New Brunswick for months of coastal duty before being moved to Ottawa, it has given the Highlanders the British soldier's unique "ability to make himself at home in any situation", and they will quickly fit into their new life with the tank crews of the armoured regiments, the ex-cavalrymen of the armoured cars, and the machine-gunners of the motor-battalions.

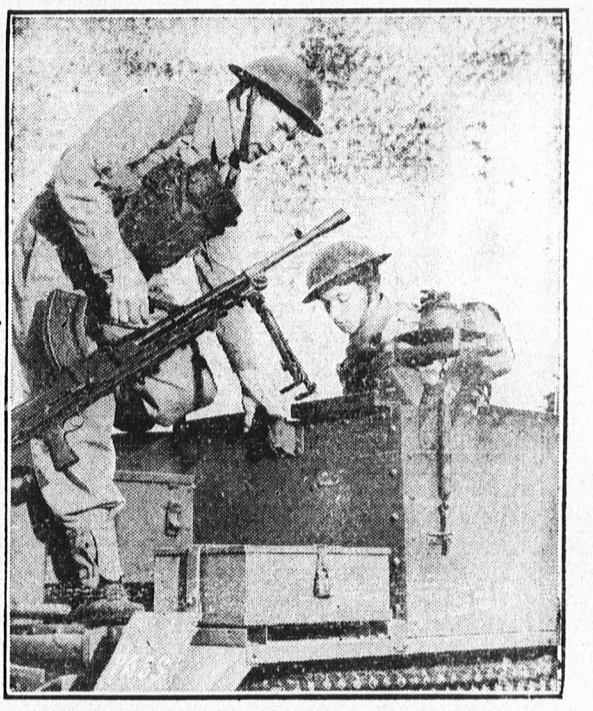
It was the most infuriating thing which could come upon a Highland regiment. The Cape Bretons were recruited almost entirely in Nova Scotia's coal-mining district, and their Scottish ancestry is so noticeable during their roll calls being taken, at some distant mustering of the clans. So the disaster was that much more galling they lost their kilts!

Ed in the Exhibition Grounds. When fire destroyed the building, they lost the kilts of the entire regiment, with the exception of those of the officers, the pipe band, and a few of the non-commissioned officers who had their dress uniforms at home. With the kilts of the Cape Bretons, went their regimental documents, historical souvenirs and mess decorations, even the cherished silver-plate of the officers' mess which was an inheritance from the old 94th Regiment, their predecessor in the Canadian Military.

The Cape Bretons' heartburning was enhanced because they sense that their kilts are gone forever. In this day of motorized infantry there is no longer weight in the once sound argument that the kilts are the finest of all marching uniforms, because of its comfort. The Cape Bretons themselves will travel by troop-carrying truck. There is only the claim of sentiment left. And the Cape Bretons have small faith that it will prevail after the war-which will be won or lost by mechanized forces, not massed-infantry armies.

However, a Highland regiment still has its soul so long as it has its regimental color and the stirring songs of the pipes which to honor it, and a tradition that must not be disgraced. So the kilts Highlanders are carrying on in good hearts.

The Cape Bretons are associated with the early history of this continent through their affiliation with the 85th and 155th Battalions, Canadian Expeditionary Force, and the battalion commander of the 85th in France, Colonel J. Ralston, present Minister of National Defence, is their honorary Colonel.
