## IN MEMORIAM

LATE REV. JOHN LAIRD DAWSON

Many in the province will learn with regret of the death of the Rev. John Laird Dawson which was announced in a telegram received in the city yesterday from Halifax.

The late Mr. Dawson was born in Tryon, P. E. I. He preceded Rev. R. G. Fulton as pastor of the First Methodist Church in this city and afterwards had charge of the York circuit which he held up to the time of his demise. He had been in failing health for some time. Last November he suffered a complete breakdown and was ordered an entire rest and change. His wife predeceased him and there are left to mourn his memory, three sons—Kenneth, connected with the Halifax Tram Railway Company; Wilbur, overseas, and Chesley, in the Signal Corps at Halifax.

In the passing of Mr. Dawson, one of the leading Methodist ministers in this Conference has gone to his eternal reward. Besides being a preacher of more than ordinary ability, the late Mr. Dawson was the author of "The World's Redemption" a work of recognized literary merit. He was a very sociable man, beloved as a Pastor and admired as a preacher.

To the bereaved family the Guardian extends most respectful sympathy.

The remains arrived last night, and the funeral will take place today at 2.30 p. m. at the residence of Mr. Charles L. Wright, Victoria, to Tryon, where interment will take place.

**GLAD TO HELP THE SOLDIERS.**—In Toronto recently a very tangible and practical movement was instituted by the Daily News of that City with a view to encouraging thoughtfulness towards soldiers. The News had a number of heart shaped placards made on which were printed the words, "Glad to Give Soldiers A Lift." These cards were offered to any motorists who would display them prominently on their cars and act accordingly. As a result they were taken up in hundreds and now practically every car in the city carries one and very many soldiers enjoy a drive and an outing that otherwise would be beyond their reach and for which they felt they had no right to ask. The Guardian has a limited number of these placards and will be glad to hand them to any owners who may desire to hold out this kind invitation to the soldiers in the city.

**LIEUT. MCARTHUR WOUNDED.**—Mrs. Chas. MacArthur, Cornwall, received the following telegram yesterday. Sincerely regret to inform you Lieut. Chas. W. MacArthur, M.M., mounted rifles, officially reported admitted to No. 8 Red Cross Hospital, August 28th. Fractured humerus. This is the second time that this gallant young island officer has been wounded. Lieut. MacArthur enlisted in the C. C. M. R. on March 1st 1915. He crossed to England in July following. The close of the year 1915 saw him on active service on the Western Front. He was with the Canadians in all the heavy fighting of 1916. It was at the battle of the Somme, October 3rd, 1916, that he was awarded the Military Medal. He returned to the trenches again, was promoted to the rank of Corporal and Sergeant on the field. After almost two years of continuous fighting his bravery and devotion to duty was further rewarded by him being recommended for a commission. In the fall of 1917 he went to England took his commission and returned to France, where he has been in further fighting until wounded, during the recent offensive. The many friends of Lieut. Chas. MacArthur will sincerely hope that he may soon recover from his wounds.
