Says Labor Party Not Taking Sides

LONDON, May 23 — (AP) — Britain's Labor Party leadership, answering left wing charges that it was snubbing Russia and clinging too closely to American policies, declared today that "the Labor Government does not propose to take sides in a line-up for the next world war."

Referring to gibes by left wing "rebels" Labor members that Britain's post-war foreign policy was based on "America provides the money while we provide the men," the ruling party said in a booklet: "That suits us better than providing both men and money."

Insistence of the booklet pointed up the possibility of a showdown with the left wing Labor members, at the Labor Party's annual five-day conference at Margate next week. Decisions of the conference are considered binding on the Labor Government.

The booklet, entitled "Cards on Table" — a phrase used frequently by Foreign Secretary Bevin — was designed partly to disarm the left-wing critics.

Ontario Student On Attempted Rape Charge

(By The Canadian Press) MILTON, Ont., May 22 — A 17-year-old Georgetown High school student, Victor Ostrander, was committed today for trial on a charge of attempted rape here after a 14-year-old girl school mate testified he had dragged her over a hill shouting "I'm a sex maniac and I'll kill you."

The girl said Ostrander had hit her over the head with a stick, cutting the left ear. "I asked him why he should pick on me and he said 'anyone would,'" she testified. In a written statement to police, Ostrander said "after I tried to assault her I said I was going to commit suicide. I thought of jumping off the railroad bridge into the river, then cutting my neck with the knife, or hanging myself."
