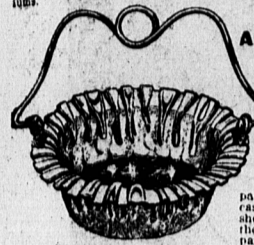

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MARITIME STOCK BREEDERS' ASSOCIATION.

TRURO, March 7.—The annual meeting of the Maritime Stock Breeders' Association was held here on Wednesday. Among the subjects that came up for discussion was the need of securing cold storage facilities, abattoirs and stock yards for the maritime provinces. A delegation composed of representatives from the Stock Breeders' Association, the Halifax Board of Trade, and the departments of agriculture of the three provinces, had just returned from Ottawa, where they interviewed the Minister of Agriculture, the acting Minister of Trade and Commerce and the Finance Minister.

The delegation reported that it was admitted at Ottawa that better live stock marketing facilities were needed in the maritime provinces. The government had made no definite promises, but the delegation felt it was virtually certain that something would soon be done. The farmers of the maritime provinces are fully awake to their needs in this respect and have decided to push their claims to the utmost.

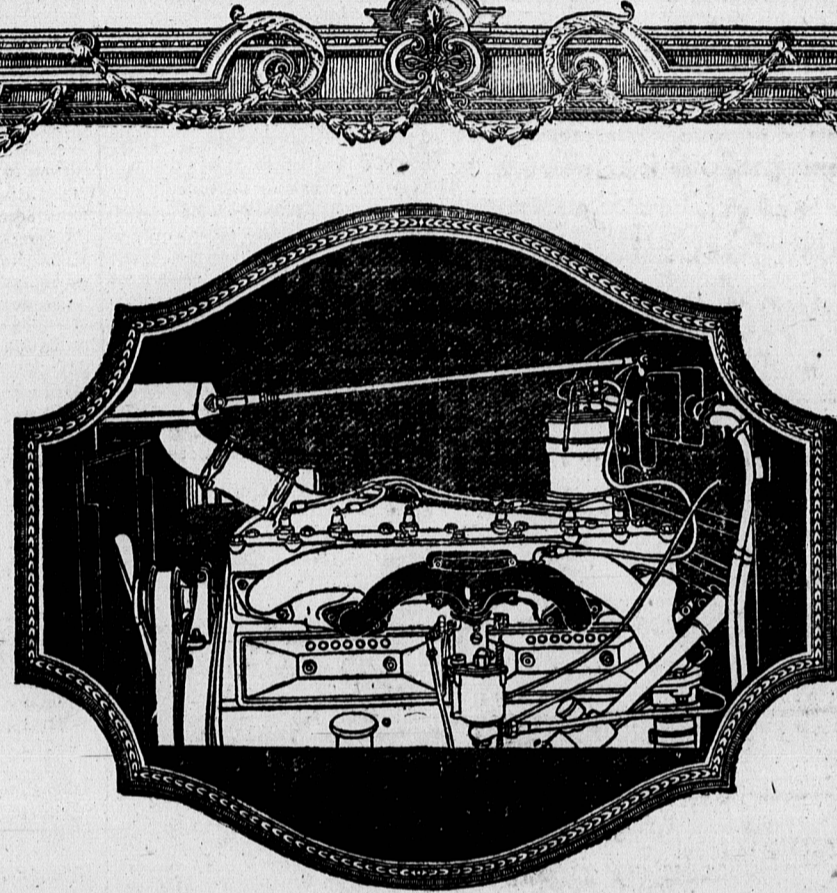
